Dear Fellow Laborers,

Psa. 11:7 - For the righteous LORD loveth righteousness; His countenance doth behold the upright. We rejoice in the goodness of Almighty God. He is able and willing to bless all those that are willing to obey Him. We continue to wage war against the flesh, the world, and the devil. Victory and defeat are not daunted by the latter for we know that God uses them both to try our souls. Pray for one of our families in Jesus Maria. Aracelie & Eduardo and their 4 little girls were robbed on Sunday night. They lost about \$180.00, which the Lord has replaced about \$90.00 of it already. They have had a very hard life, but since coming to the Savior they are a precious addition to our church family out in Jesus Maria.

The "Maranatha Baptist Church" in the prison here at El Llano is flourishing slowly, but steadily; we are to baptize this month. We received some disappointing news recently that we would not be able to build inside the facility. Praise the Lord we still are able to meet under a pavilion in a beautiful garden. We've been battling against some heretics that say they are prophets, but deny the deity of Christ. As a result of false teaching, some have left our services. In spite of the set backs the men are faithful and we have won some of their family members and continue to try to ground them.

The three works in Aguascalientes continue to do well and we have a family that helps us at the third traffic circle church, (Grace & Truth Baptist Church). Please pray for Rodolfo, Rosa, Rodolfito, Lalo, & Nissi. On Father's Day we will be celebrating the Anniversary of Grace & Truth Baptist Church of Aguascalientes - 8 years old and the Anniversary of Liberty Baptist Church of Jesus Maria - 12 years old. After honoring all of our Dad's in the service, we'll have a renewing of the wedding vows of Hermana Maria & Hermano Paco. Please pray for the work at El Novillo, a small ranch in the state of Jalisco, it is the smallest of the 4 works we have and subsequently the weakest. We are struggling in Jalisco as we have so much going on in Aguas that we can hardly find the time to get out there. Hermano Salvador in Matacillas continues to meet on Sunday afternoons out there in this small ranch. Please pray for his family as they are still outside of the fold.

As we continue to battle, we are building at the same time. We are constructing a 10'x21' block room for Jessica our daughter to live in and have just finished roofing a 20'x20' addition to her ministry room where she prepares lessons and crafts for our children's ministries. The addition is no more than a tin roof with concrete floor and in the future a screened enclosure. With these additions she will be very comfortable for years to come.

We also have started a building for the storage of materials for distribution as this is a tremendous part of our ministry. We have elected not to print but to distribute material that exist. Our home church is putting together a shipment of John & Romans for us, we have New Testaments, Booklets by Spurgeon and other great preachers, because we are in the center of Mexico we hope to be able to supply this material to other missionaries.

We have several people in our discipleship program which consist of 28 lessons and one on tutelage.

Pray for Hermano Miguel and his wife, Lilli, as she has petitioned for a divorce. We are stunned by her attitude as she has been faithful for over 9 years. We hardly know what to think and hold out little hope that she was ever saved from the start. Miguel continues to attend the services and has a good attitude, but has also lost 2 of his 3 children to this misfortune. On a happier note we have another couple that has risen to take their place in Grace & Truth Baptist Church - Aguascalientes. I believe and pray that this family will take our place and if not that we will send them to the city of Toluca as a missionary family. I will be greatly surprised at anything less.

We appreciate so much your prayers and financial support, with out which we could not do what we do. We pray daily for you and yours. May God richly bless you for your faithfulness where you are.

“Newsletter – April-2010”

Our Communications this month is long overdue! This year has started out being a very different and difficult year for our family, *BUT!* God has never left us or failed to take care of us, there is just something different about the year of “2010” that God wants to teach us.

January was cold and we all had a hard time keeping warm! Our Kid’s meeting out in Jesus Maris saw over 80 in attendance and Jessica’s club here in La Herrada was around 23 – they meet in the afternoon outside and it being cold affects attendance. For the first time in 12 years we saw snow here in the city of Aguascalientes!

February, Bill preached a conference in the city of Irapuato, about 3 hours south of us. It was a great meeting and the church was full every night. Irapuato is the city of Strawberries; they grow year round and are huge and very sweet. One of the families in the church has a 75 acre farm and they brought in a 30 pound basket for us to take home. On Valentine’s Day we had a special day at church combining all three churches and having a pitch-in-dinner. Jessica & I made a huge strawberry short cake and made jam & froze a couple of bags of the left over strawberries. At the end of the month we had a conference with Pastor David Guerrero and all three of the churches attended each night.

March saw the weather beginning to warm up, but our Kid’s meetings each month were having a low attendance of 40 in Jesus Maria and in the 20’s here in La Herrada. One big blessing is the Kid’s clubs out in Jesus Maria is all taken care of by the folks out there and since December some of our folks here on the third circle have been doing a lot of the work for the Kid’s clubs here at La Herrada. One of our men from the third circle has been coming each month to give the Gospel and give the invitation here at La Herrada.

April brought in spring, but it also brought in problems with our water here at La Herrada. We had to start filling drums at the church on the third circle and filling up our holding tank here at our house in La Herrada. A couple of weeks ago Bill went with Jessica to fill and empty the drums and he pulled his leg. He was down for a couple of weeks not being able to sit and that meant not being able to sit in the truck to even go to the doctor. One of our men brought his doctor over to see Bill and just about all of the men from Jesus Maria and third circle pitched in and took over all of the services even out in El Novillo and the prison ministry. Some helped with the water and took to time to come up to the house to do work for Bill. Our landlord from the third circle came up and gave us the name of a man that hauls clean water up to a house that he has out in the country. The water is drinkable, but we want drink it, its 1,900 liters for 300.00 pesos or around \$28.50. The day he was to bring up the water, we checked our holding tank, it was half full, and the water was coming in. We’ve not had a problem since then, but it’s normal for this time of the year. The ranchers & farmers need the water until the rains come and our pumps only run 1 or 2 days for 4 hours during that time. They also control the speed of the water that comes in.

La Iglesia Bautista “Gracia y Verdad” – third circle in Aguascalientes is doing very well in some ways, but in other ways needs to let God work in there hearts! We have a full house on Sunday mornings, couples are stepping in and singing specials, Lorenzo is playing for the invitation, and Rodolfo leads the singing. We have visitors just about every service and half of them have accepted the Lord as their Savior. Bill has our churches listed on the internet and a week ago a young man came in on a Wednesday

night. He found our church on the internet and since he works in Aguascalientes he can come to the services on Wednesday nights. Our church out in El Novillo is 20 minutes from him in the state of Zacatecas. That puts him riding the bus close to 2 hours to get to us, but since he works in Aguascalientes during the week he can easily get to the Wednesday night service, just cannot get in on Sunday. Pray for Juan Carlos. Sunday nights and Wednesday night we see about one third of the people return for church. The church has had one family join this year so far.

La Primera Iglesia Bautista “Libertad” out in Jesus Maria has a full house on Sunday mornings, Sunday nights, and Wednesday nights. Every first Saturday of the month they have a Kid’s service and 8 to 10 adults take care of everything that is needed: Bible story, singing, giving the Gospel, invitation, refreshments and candy bags. Brother Juan Marlin drives the old van and brings in around 20 kids and adults, the rest are walk in. There have been visitors and the church has had two families join this year.

Iglesia Bautista Biblica de la Fe out in the village of El Novillo has been having a steady 20 attending the service on Saturday. Since the village is an hour one way by van (they don’t run buses out that far) from the third circle in Aguascalientes, Bill is not only praying for a couple to help him out there, but they would have to have a car, also.

The Prison Ministry in El Llano is doing well. Hermano Raul and Rodolfo both go with Bill to the prison and help from time to time with the preaching or teaching of the men. They are still running around 23. The young man, Israel, that was Bill’s assistant out in the prison when he was not there, was released back in November. He went with the Pastor that he had been saved under and is having a hard time adjusting to the outside. He called Bill last week and came over to see him, but turned up drunk at church on Sunday night. We have been praying for a long time that God will some how use the land we have here, us, and some other family to start a half-way house here for the men.

Pray for:

La Iglesia Bautista “Gracia y Verdad” on the third circle in Aguascalientes:

Miguel and his wife, Lili – she has started divorce papers. Their children are: Ramon, Alejandra, Anahi, & Henry. Miguel has been faithful to church on Sunday morning & Wednesday night with Anahi & Henry and he sometimes comes alone on Sunday nights. Ramon & Alejandra are Lili’s children to two other men.

Lorenzo as he starts a new business.

Ricardo has left the commercial airlines due to his age and has joined a law firm here in Aguascalientes.

Sarita, Yamid, Denisse, as Sarita’s husband and the girl’s dad is in Alabama. Both girls are attending the University here in Aguascalientes.

Juan Pablo as he was in a car accident a week ago and was hospitalized in a private hospital here, CMQ, because of head injuries, but he was in church on Sunday and is back to school. It is a scary thing when you have worked so hard to put your son through 2 years of college and he wakes up from an accident and says he cannot remember anything!

Rodolfo, Rosa, Rodolfo Jr. Lalo, & Nissi. Rodolfo is serving the Lord more and more, helping Bill in the prison, is taking on more of the responsibilities of visitation, and is preaching some in the church.

Lalo, Angelica & their family. Both Lalo & Angelica have terrible back problems and it is starting to keep them out of church more and more.

La Primera Iglesia Bautista “Libertad” in Jesús María:

Juan & Mari that they will take more of an interest in the workings of the church. Juan completed the Bible Institute that was held at the church for four years and Mari went to Bible College.

Javier & Artimesa - Javier struggles with sin in his life that he just cannot let go of. They have two sons, Javier Jr. and Paco.

Juan Carlos & Beatrice - Recently married and she has two sons from another marriage. Her oldest son (8 years old) is almost totally deaf. Many trials there.

Mari & Paco – They have four grown children and have taken in six younger children. The younger children have no papers and cannot go to school. Mari & Paco are in their late 40's and neither of them can read.

Juan Marlin's wife, Graciela, is not saved.

Personal Needs:

I was diagnosed with inflamed large intestine and that of yet is the most painful illness that I've yet to have. It started the end of January and was at its end the middle of March. Bill & I celebrated our 39th wedding anniversary on March 17th, sitting in the office of a specialist. With medication and diet, I am doing so much better. Bill is doing much better with his leg, but has to baby it and it is driving him crazy! Please continue to pray for our son, Matthew, & daughter-in-law, Rachel.

Ministry Needs:

Our home church, Maranatha Baptist Church, Covington, Indiana, will be later on this year putting together 10,000 John & Romans for us. They will be shipping them here to Aguascalientes for us, if you do not know where that is look at a map, find McAllen, Texas, and follow it across the border to Reynosa, Monterrey, Saltillo, Zacatecas, and then Aguascalientes. If you kept going south about 6 to 8 hours more you would come to Mexico City. They will be contacting some of our supporting pastors to help with the cost of shipping.

Jessica is supported as a missionary helper here in Mexico by us and three other churches. She uses the money for the ministry with the kids here in our churches. She has one big need and that is a structure over the area here on our property in La Herrada for her kid's meetings. Bill would like to make the structure big enough to cover 50 people. The structure would be a concrete floor, metal structure covered with a tarp and tin roof. Right now they have class every second Saturday at 12:00 noon under a tarp tied to trees with dirt or grass according to the season. We take down benches and a couple of tables for them to sit and do their activities on. Just keep trying to call.

Jessica had a tragedy back in the month of March. She does so much of our ministry with the computer that her Great Uncle Frank gave her a gift of money for her birthday to buy a new computer. She went to withdraw the money out from a HSBC bank ATM and her account was cleaned out! A couple of weeks later, Bill's brother, Michael, down in Veracruz had the same thing happen to him at the ATM, but it was his work fund. He has no other option than to use the ATM. Here in Aguascalientes, we can at times cash a check, but it is getting harder and harder to do so. We may have to find a bank in Covington that wires money internationally so we can open a bank account here. Pray that we can keep back enough money each week from our support to be able to buy her that computer. Anyone in the ministry knows how important a computer can be.

We also have a big need that is starting to present itself to us and that is a need of a different vehicle. Dear Friends & Church Family,

Spring is finally here and with it the warm weather. We had a very unusual winter; we even had a few snow flurries! It was the first snow since 1998! We also had as much rain in four days in February as we had in our whole rainy season last year.

Every second Saturday of the month, we have a Kid's Club in La Herrada, which is the ranch where we live. Last Saturday, we had 41 neighbors in attendance. We had a great time and the people seem to really enjoy themselves. Denisse taught the Bible story about creation, Yamid lead the singing, Brother Rodolfo gave the invitation, and I set up the tables, benches, tied down the tarp for shade, prepared the craft of the day, and the refreshments, and taught the memory verse. We've only had one adult call on the Lord so far, but I know that the Lord is working in hearts. Señora Maria listens to all that is being said and has many questions; but her family is very Catholic.

We are in great need of a structure for the Kid's Club here were we live. My dad wants to build a metal structure, concrete floor, tarps for walls, and a tin roof for seating 50 people. We are praying that God will provide and we will be able to build the structure sometime this year. During the rainy season it is hard to have a kid's meeting and sometimes during the winter, it is too windy and cold. I have had the blessing of teaching one of the national Pastor's here in Aguascalientes' daughter, Cristina, piano lessons. She has been playing at her church, but needed some extra help to make things go a little smother, learn new songs, and just be more confident when she plays. When I am in my kid's class at the third circle, Brother Lorenzo plays the guitar for the invitation since I cannot leave my class. He and his family love to sing! They play the guitar and the mandolin, and what a blessing they are to us.

We had been out of water for almost three weeks, and had to fill five 55-gallon barrels of water from the church on the third circle and then siphon them into the cistern. Every year we go through a time that the city water is diverted to other areas and we are left without a drop! Thankfully, the water has been coming in and our holding tank is full. My dad hurt his leg while helping me with the water, he was in bed for two weeks and was unable to walk or sit and was barely able to stand. He is doing much better now. While he was down, the men rallied together and helped out. Dad was flooded with visits from church families and his phone hardly stopped ringing with calls of encouragement.

Please continue to pray for the people of Aguascalientes. We have started making tract bags to hand out which contains a John & Romans, two tracts and a piece of candy. They seem to be very well received; we hope that in time, we will see standing room only in both churches and many souls saved.

I thank you all from your prayers concerning my family; my mother's health has improved greatly. She has been almost back to full speed, which is so great to see. My dad has a few building projects going on, and the Lord has given him the strength to do all that he does. As for myself, I just try to keep up with them!

Dear Fellow Laborers for Christ,

Since our last prayer letter and update we have covered around 7,000 miles in our return trip to some of our supporting churches that we have not been back to in 14 years or so. I was also able to fly out to Seattle, Washington, and preach in a church there and see some of my relatives that I have not seen for many years. Upon my return to Indianapolis, Indiana, we went to St. Johnsbury, Vermont, to encourage our son and daughter-in-law. We only intended to stay out for a month and it wound up costing us 2 months. We wanted to meet our new Pastor, but he has felt God calling him to start an Independent Baptist Church in Thomasville, Alabama, so he is no longer our Pastor. My mother was taken ill and we were able to spend a little time with her. With the extra time we were able to do all that we set out to do and a little more. We saw people saved and some folks make decisions to dedicate themselves to a greater degree. Jessica stayed here in Mexico the whole time, to her credit she is a real champion for God and we thank Him everyday for her.

We came back the night before Thanksgiving to find that most things were as we had left them, but one of my men that was doing the preaching for me at our church on the 3rd circle in Aguascalientes had a serious family problem develop. Because Jessica was here, she was able to call me and help rearrange the preaching schedule to cover all of the services.

At the church in Jesus Maria, we did see some growth as 2 women I led to the Lord before I left were baptized. I had studied with them and one of my good men, Juan Javier, continued those studies and it was a first time for him to baptize someone. Though we came back to some problems we were thrilled to get back and see God working in the lives of our folks and so many of them staying faithful; my wife and I missed our home, daughter, and all of our folks. The work is hard, but we do enjoy seeing things happen for the glory of the God of Heaven.

Our first Christmas service will be here in the ranch where we live on December 19. Our folks from the church on the 3rd circle will be handing the Christmas story, giving of the Gospel, singing, & refreshments. Jessica puts it all together and teaches all that come a craft, my wife makes all of the candy, fruit, and toy bags we give out. Pray for me as I will be out in El Novillo for their weekly service. Sunday, December 20, is our Christmas party for the kids on the 3rd circle and Jesus Maria. December 22, is the Tuesday out in the prison that I will be able to take in something special for the men that meet with me to have for Christmas. Last year they allowed me to bring in 100 tamales! December 26, is the Christmas service for our ranch work in El Novillo and on December 27, both of our churches on the 3rd circle and Jesus Maria will get together for their Christmas service and pitch-in-dinner.

We covet your prayer for Matthew & Rachel, our son & daughter-in-law and the ranch works, churches, and the prison. Pray for Jessica and my wife as they plan all the actives for the children and music program. Little is much when God is in it. Thanks for all you do for us!

We have finished up an incredible busy summer with several camps and retreats for our children. We saw several saved here in the ranch as we had a special day for them and the attendance was great! It was very encouraging as these folks are our neighbors and we want to reach them.

God has opened up another ranch work called: “El Novillo” and we are going full steam ahead with 2 meetings a week and soul winning Saturdays. We are seeing between 20 and 30 pretty faithful and we hope to buy land one day. I am also continuing to knock doors in Chinampas, Matancillas, and La Paz, in the state of Jalisco. We have seen very few that are interested, but believe God wants us there.

I have seen an increase in the prison ministry to around 20 or more men attending the service as when I started it was only 2 – 5 men in the service. It is my sad duty to report that the Youth prison is no longer open to me because of lack of interest on their part.

La Iglesia Bautista “Gracia y Verdad” and the Primera Iglesia Bautista “Libertad” still continue to struggle, but at least onward as they win souls and grow in the Lord. We have seen several new families begin to show interest and at times we hardly have room for everyone. My brother, Michael, came up from Veracruz and preached a conference last week and with everyone we saw over 100 in attendance each day. He preached 9 times and God used him mightily; we had several decisions, thanks be to God!

We make ourselves ready for a busy winter as we not only have the ministry of the different works, but much maintenance and construction as we are building some well needed living quarters. We are also improving the facilities where we have combined church meetings and camps. We continue to build as God gives the finances; He has been so good to us.

Thanks so much for your prayers and financial support. As our ministry expands we are looking to be more involved in the ranch works and leave more of the responsibility to Brother Miguel Martinez and Brother Juan Vasquez, please pray for these men and their families as they have been with us since the start.

May God be real to you and yours as you serve him where you are.

Good Afternoon!

It is overcast here and we haven't had much rainy lately. Jessica left for the kid's club over in Jesus Maria and to run a few errands on her way over there. Electric is due next week, so she has to stop at the store in Las Norias to pick up our electric bill. They don't deliver here in La Herrada, so we have to stop in Las Norias for our bill.

Bill has started on Jessica's bathroom, walk in closet, and Florida room. He hired two men to do the work and he watches them and works when he can. We also had a back hoe come and start trying to level out the front yard. Since we are down hill from the top of the hill we get flooded out. Each year we have terraced and poured more concrete, but leveling out the front yard will do a lot to help with the flooding. He'll be back on Monday and then on Thursday to do more leveling out,

Bill is real sick today, I think he ate something out in one of the ranches. We have him on medicine and I gave him a shot for nausea so he is resting better.

We are praying that since Bill's Aunt Kathy is home they have her resting as comfortable as possible. She has cancer and doesn't have much time left. Aunt Kathy is Barbara (Bill's Mom) sister and she lives out in Seattle, Washington. We are praying that God will give her pain free days.

Our Chihuahua Pecas isn't doing well. We can't get her to eat much and then she usually throws it up. We had test done and now the doctor wants to take more blood and do more test and a sonogram. He has to take the blood from the vein in her neck and it freaks her out and takes days for her to get over it. I'm not sure what we are going to do. It just about kills us to see her so sick and we can't stand the thought of

losing her, she is 13 years old. Jessica has the name of a doctor over in Jesus Maria that builds wheel chairs for disabled dogs. So next week we will go over and check him out. Beanie, Jessica's 3 month old disabled puppy, needs one for his back legs and the ones we found on line ran about \$350.00. He still has a year to grow, so Bill is thinking of rebuilding the one he made him to at least take care of a year of growth.

We are looking forward to being in Foley the latter part of the last week of September and the first week of October. It is going to be a fast month for us, but a good one. We are really looking forward to being with old friends in Alabama, West Virginia, PA again, and then on to Indiana to meet our new Pastor.

I made a fig cake yesterday and it's pretty good. It called for a teaspoon of cloves and I think I'll make it a 1/2 teaspoon next time. Jessica made pickle beets with boiled eggs. It is a PA Dutch thing. My Daddy like boiled eggs in hot pepper vinegar and even hot dogs in hot pepper vinegar. He never had boiled eggs in beet juice, but I bet he would have like that too!

I have green beans in my garden and the tomato plants are growing, but the caterpillars ate my green lima sprouts and the other seedlings that I had planted. They did leave my okra sprouts along, don't blame them, I hate touching okra myself.

I had better close for now, the guys are getting done and I need to go and pay them.

Dear Fellow Laborers in Christ,

Psa. 46:10 Be still, and know that I am God: I will be exalted among the heathen, I will be exalted in the earth.

We are very excited about what the Lord has and is doing in us and through us. We continue to marvel at how our great God works in the lives of those He has given me to shepherd at Grace & Truth Baptist Church of Aguascalientes and Liberty Baptist Church of Jesus Maria. I have renewed marital vows and preached funerals since our last letter and it never ceases to amaze and astound me of how interested God is in the details of the lives of His people.

I am thrilled to see the men in prison respond to God's Word weekly as I teach and preach. Pray for me on Tuesday's between 10:00 AM to 2:00 PM. Last week I took one of our men from Grace & Truth Baptist Church and they wouldn't let him in with me. He wore boots, so they made him wait out in my car the whole time I was there. I need helpers and the devil fights it all the way. Please pray for Israel a young man convicted of selling drugs and after serving 7 years is ready to leave the system and is fired up for God and desires to come along with us and serve.

Also, pray for Rodolfo who is being challenged in his walk with God, but is resisting the urge to follow God's leading in his life. This is the second time in a few years that he has come to me and nothing as of yet has resulted from it. We have a young couple in the other church who remain faithful but are obviously being tortured by satin. The young wife went to Bible College and the husband has been with the church from the beginning. When I married them we had such hopes they would turn out for God, but they have hardened their hearts, Please pray! In the ranches (small rural towns) I continue to preach Christ where Christ has not been preached. There are literally thousands of these seemingly forgotten places that do not have anything but the standard cathedral. In one of the ranches I was meeting with 2 - 8 people on Saturday, but the wife of the household went illegal to the states to see her children and now the husband is

too busy fixing up his house in case she wants to stay and he has to sell and move illegally to the states with her. In the ranch of El Novillo, I continue to meet with 20 - 30 people on Tuesday night at 6:30 PM. The family had been saved years ago, but when the missionary left over 10 years ago they had no where to go to church. One of the men in the family moved to Aguascalientes and attended a Baptist Church and 2 years ago moved his family to Canada. He is a school teacher and came back to Aguascalientes to work for the school system for a year and a half to receive his retirement from them. It was through him that we started driving over an hour on Tuesday nights to reach the families that had been saved in his home town. His nephew and wife are growing in the Lord and I am praying that once Juan goes back to Canada in January, I will be able to use Jesus and his wife in the ministry out there. In Jesus Maria we are seeing some new folks, pray for the Palacios they are one of our newest families. They have a 10 year old boy who was stoned the other day as he was witnessing for his Lord. His Mom, Dad, and little sister are very active.

The trouble with the drug cartel is growing and over 7,000 have died this year in drug connected incidents. Every 60 minutes someone is abducted here in Latin America. The swine flu has had little affect on us only one person that we are connected with has been confirmed to have had the flu. The suicide rate climes yearly here in Aguas and we are continually threatened by the reckless way in which people drive; 1 fatality every 2 days here in Aguas alone.

God has been so good to us as we were able to fly up for a week a visit our original sending church as they had a Jubilee meeting. It was wonderful for us as we seldom get to attend any kind of special meetings here in Mexico. We heard some 20 messages and everyone was meant for us. It warmed our hearts as we felt to some degree had gotten callous. It was like frosting on a cake to see friends from the past and always a blessing to remember what God has done and is still doing at Liberty Baptist Church in Ephrata, PA. We are especially grateful for our good friend Pastor Guy Mosebrook, Evangelist Bob Hamblen and Pastor Jerry Harris who conducted the singing. We had forgotten how we missed those wonderful hymns in English. Every song, special music, and the great preaching served to rekindle a fire in us that we realize now burns lower from time to time. It's an occupational hazard you might say to continually give out and not noticing as you're straining to minister. We praise God for His careful nudging in making it plain to us that we need that kind of refreshing from time to time.

Well Praise God and extol His Holy Name! Thanks for your faithfulness to us! May He be real to you all.
