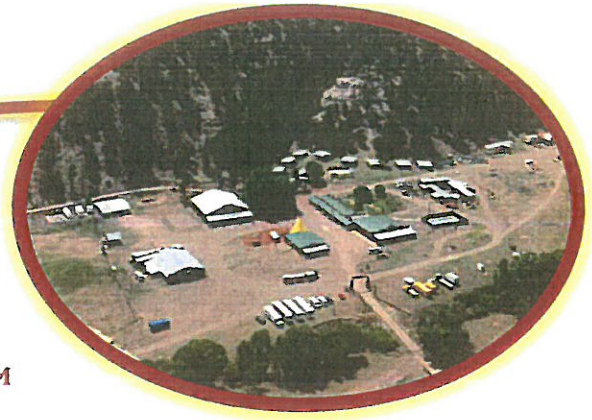

You cannot enjoy the beautiful rainbow of God's promises without the storm and what a storm it has been. We have a saying around here: "when it rains pours then it floods." God has been so amazingly good to us through it all. He has protected, guided and he has allowed us to thrive. This year, as it has been for so many, has been one of the most difficult and challenging years of our lives and ministry. This summer held its own challenges as it always does when you are on the front line. Then the devastating flood came. On July 23 at 7:30 p.m. a 4-foot wall of water came down the entire width of our valley. God is so good! All 120 campers and staff were safely in the church. The destruction that was great would have been so much worse if anyone would have been hurt or perished in the rising flood waters. God's hand of mercy and protection was upon us.

We have been busy cleaning up and rebuilding for the past 19 weeks. We started the very next day cleaning out the mud and water and the work has yet to stop. So much has had to be put on hold. God is so good and we are blessed with such great friends. The very next week after the flood, they came out to help. Mt. Powell Baptist Church from the Navajo Reservation came out. Although we did not have the accommodations they brought a group of 20 people and worked all week. The first building cleaned was our church. They were able to accomplish so much that week. It is amazing we had groups that specialized in disaster relief commit to come help however never showed. Red Cross and FEMA said they would provide funding but never came through either. We believe it was the floods back east and then the Hurricanes that prevented them from coming to help, but God is so faithful. It has been the local churches and friends of the camp that have come through both physically and financially. So far every need has been met. We have months of work ahead before we get back to where we were, but we are getting closer every day.

We are finishing the mission house that was devastated during the flood. The motel rooms have been re-sheet rocked and now we are ready to tile the floors. The flooring has been ordered the church floors and we still have an incredible amount of work to do and need around \$50,000.00 to accomplish our goals. We know the Lord will provide.

During all this the Lord provided us with a beautiful 30x50 shop. This building is an incredible building that we can use for a mechanic shop, wood working shop, and one central location to keep all our tools and equipment. God has provided us with such a beautiful and stunning rainbow after the storm.

Dear Pastor and Church Family

So many things have gone on since I wrote last. My trip to Africa with my son was amazing. My father helped to start the camp in Benin, West Africa 14 years ago. This year they moved it so I could go and be there. It was amazing. They copy our schedule and our activities. It was such a blessing to see. We had 194 come to the camp in Benin and 42 saved. In Togo we had 175 come to camp and 30 saved. In Benin Deaf come from seven countries and in Togo Deaf from nine different countries showed up. God greatly blessed. There was 12 Muslims that accepted Christ as their Savior. WE are planning Deaf camps in five countries next year. Please pray we can raise the much-needed funds for next year.

We arrived home Tuesday night and family arrive the next day for my father's funeral. My father's funeral was September 3. We had a good turnout. It was all harder than I imagined but God's grace was sufficient.

With jet lag and everything going on I was not getting much sleep. On Labor Day I fell asleep driving and totaled our family van. This was very discouraging. The Lord allowed me to be absolutely safe through the accident. Pray we can be able to get another vehicle as we will be going back on deputation October 8th. If you have a family car you are selling or would be interested in donation please let us know.

During all of this I was told Jimmy Rapp and his wife Ashley (our secretary of 19 years) will be moving to Albuquerque to help a church in the area. Our prayer is that God, greatly blesses them.

Those that support them can continue to do so. Their forwarded address is at the bottom. If you would like to support other staff families that would be a great blessing also. We have two young families on staff that for sure could use the support.

God has been so faithful. We are excited about next summer and God opening doors for more camps in West Africa. Thank you for your continued support.

Dear Giver,

God is so good. We are near the end of our second week of work camp. It has taken months of consistent and constant work to be able to open for our first group of campers to arrive this coming Monday. By the time you are reading this we will have a camp full of kids running around.

Looking back over this past year we can testify to this verse: Romans 8:28 "And we know that all things work together for good to them that love God, to them who are the called according to his purpose." The flood was massive and absolutely devastating. We were told by the disaster relief groups, that came out to look at the damage, it would take well over \$100,000.00 and we would need to close for two years. Two different groups that were supposed to come out and help never showed up. These two groups are large international Disaster relief groups each run by a large church denomination. We believe it was because of the floods in New Jersey and the hurricanes back east that they were not able to come out. This turned out to be a huge blessing as they were planning to demo and tear down everything, including the plumbing and the electrical. The Lord intervened and greatly blessed by allowing a Pastor and his men to come out and inspect the buildings. He was a state inspector for many years before becoming a pastor. After taking down several walls he showed me the water damage did not reach any of the electrical lines. Only about six inches of water damage occurred. This is due to our staff and one of the churches, Mt Powell Baptist Church, from the Reservation that sent out around forty people, being able to get the water and mud out starting the next day. Because we are out west, our humidity unless its raining is extremely low, even during the rainy season. Praise the Lord the damaged walls and insulation were replaced.

The flood has turned out to be a blessing as we were able to do much needed renovations all over camp. Twelve floors were replaced, one missions trailer was completely remodeled, all the motel rooms received much needed work as well. All have tile in the rooms and bathrooms now. All the plumbing in the showers were redone, which will be a huge improvement. The girls' dorm has been totally redone with a new tile floor and much needed remodeled bathroom. All the classrooms, in the church, have new floors and improvements. All of this is paid for. God is so GOOD!

Part of this letter is to share the good news and blessings of what God has done these past nine months. The other part is to ask for prayer and to ask if you would consider helping financially. Camp is here and as you are painfully aware the cost has gone up dramatically on everything. We are shocked by some of the costs. The cost for hay has more than doubled, food and utilities and fuel have all gone up. Some four times and some even ten times more than normal. For example: we are 120 miles away from Walmart, 280 from a Sam's club. A round trip to Walmart is 240 miles while Sam's is 520. It takes dozens of trips in getting supplies for summer. We have always used Amazon, but now we are getting to know

the UPS driver and FedEx driver very well. We will only have three paying camps this summer out of ten camps. We have always kept it at or near cost. We should have raised our prices this year by \$100.00 but since we send out the schedule and post cards in January by the latest, we could not. Adding up everything just associated with the cost of camp our cost per camper is now \$280.00. This means for even our paying camps we will lose \$130.00 per camper.

I am so thankful we are a ministry and not a business; so thankful the Lord is looking for opportunities to show himself strong on our behalf. I am so blessed to know he will never leave us or forsake us. These are stressful times, but one cannot have a great testimony without going through some great tests.

My father's book "Vision, Adventure, and Faith" is full of trial after trial and then miracle after miracle. We have already quickly gone through the funds we had for this summer, and we are only on the third week of camp. We know from 47 years of experience that the Lord will take care of us. We are putting our full faith and trust in Him and know he will take care of His ministry, Romans 5:3-5 "And not only so, but we glory in tribulations also: knowing that tribulation worketh patience; And patience, experience; and experience, hope; And hope maketh not ashamed; because the love of God is shed abroad in our hearts by the Holy Ghost which is given unto us."

I so love this verse and its powerful promise. I know God will continue to strengthen our faith through this as the Lord shows himself mighty and meets every need.

We ask and petition you to pray for this ministry and the staff daily. If you would like to take part in helping financially, we know you will be richly blessed. We never know which summer will be our last so we must always give it our all. I also ask that you be in much prayer for Pastor and Mrs. Lang. Pastor Lang's health this summer has made it so that they will not be able to come back for the summer. Right now, his physical health is so poor he is unable to board a plane to come home. He is very discouraged by this and can greatly use your prayers. If you can call or send a letter to him, please do so. His presence is greatly missed and him not being here is felt by all, and me especially as this is the first summer without my father by my side.

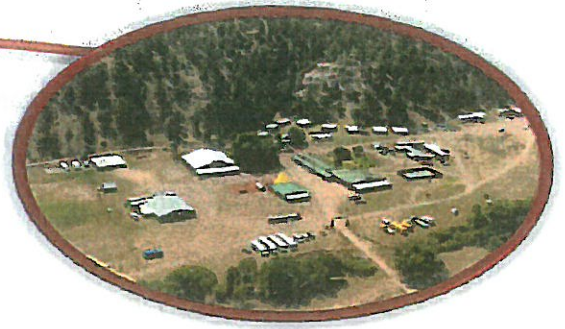

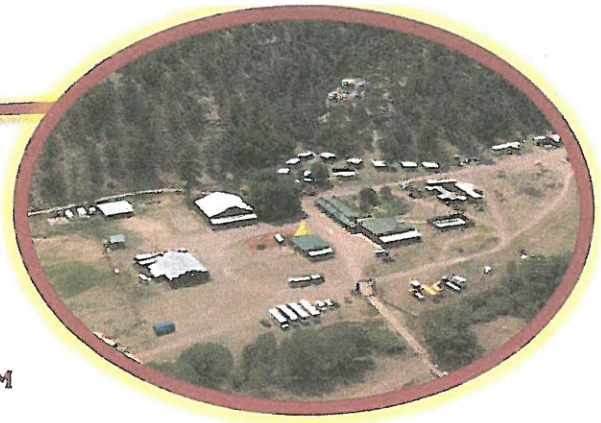

We are taking the sheetrock off our buildings and taking out the muddy wet insulation up so high as it is ruined. Then we will have to put in new insulation when it is completely dry and new sheetrock. The motel rooms, girl's dorm, offices and school room will need new flooring as well. It is hard work and very time consuming but will eventually get all done. Most of our fences are completely gone. Broken limbs, wood and all kinds of things that washed up against them took out the posts and the high strong water pressure took them all away. Our horses know where home is and are staying nearby. All of the land markers have changed and nothing looks familiar. Our backhoe is still working on the mud piled everywhere.

Folks thank you so very much for the very generous support gift of \$250.00 for the Lord's work here. We appreciate it so very much. Many have given to help with the flood damage which is helping so very much. A great big "thank you" to ALL!! May the Lord richly bless you!

Souls are still being saved in our church services! The world is becoming a bigger mess every day. Maybe Jesus Christ will rapture us soon, but we'll keep serving Him until the trumpet calls us home.

The Lord willing we should be returning to Florida the first or second week of October. We look forward to seeing you once again. We're praying for Pastor Stewart as he recovers. We love you and thank God for you. Make sure you are ready.

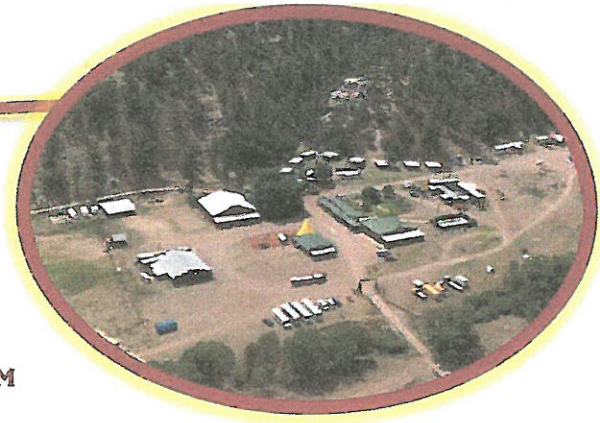

Dear Pastor Stewart, staff and friends,

We have gotten behind on some of our "thank you" letters. As you know on the last night of our big Jr. Teen camp; Friday night when all of the rewards were being given out, it started raining pretty hard. We noticed water was beginning to come into the church from under the walls. Pretty soon the whole floor was covered and getting higher and higher, not just water but also thick mud. Several buildings tied together with the church, offices, Pastor's lounge, classroom for our school kids here at the Ranch, girl's dorm, snack shop and all of the motel rooms on that side were terribly flooded with a thick slimy mud. The water, mud and logs, large commercial propane tanks and all kinds of trash from miles away came through the opening between the motel rooms and the snack shop like it was shot out of a canon. It ripped several of our full propane tanks out from their connections and sent them flying away also and we lost all of the propane in them. It was also coming at the end of the motels between Pastor Craig and Debbie's home and the end of the motels. Then it was also coming past the end of the church and other set of motel rooms. It flooded our entire area. It flooded our kitchen and dining hall also. We are thanking the Lord most everyone was in the church. Some mothers wanted to take their children back to the motel rooms but we had to tell them that absolutely no one can leave the safety of the church. They would have been swept away and probably killed by the high rising water and big heavy metal objects and huge logs and trees they kept coming through with the extremely high rushing water. It kept this up until late in the night. Praise the Lord no one was injured!!! We had heard the forecast and sometimes our road will wash out if we get high water through the creek so we had told everyone to put their cars, buses and vans on the highway which is way above our creek. We were sure our bridge would wash out but we were thinking after the water would go down people could walk out on the narrow strip of land and get to their vehicles. The next morning so much of their things were covered in mud but they were able to walk out and carry things a little at a time to their vehicles.

The next week was to be a very large Indian camp but it had to be canceled. Praise the Lord the next week 31 Indians, mostly adults from Mt. Powell Baptist Church, came with all kinds of equipment. They worked hard and long days to help dig out high piles of mud from the church, our camp office, Sunday School rooms, nursery, motel rooms, etc. The camp office, which is Pastor Craig's office and Ashley's, is totally out of

commission for now. I don't know when this will be fixed and it will take thousands of dollars to get us back and running again. We appreciate so very much you bringing your bobcat and helping clean up mud for several days. One of our men was running our backhoe almost nonstop in between having to stop and buy parts and fix it. Some men were coming to put up our new shop building this week which most of the material was under feet of mud and we are afraid some of the parts are missing. In forty-six years we have NEVER had water or mud inside of OUR BUILDINGS.

Several miles north of us a ranch had build two large lakes, damming up Apache Creek shutting off any water in our creek for our horses to drink. It wasn't just because of the rain; when these two lakes filled up the dams washed out sending a high wall of water in everything in its path. This also broke down all fences for many miles as broken trees, branches, water tanks and everything hit the fences and broke them flat! PRAY FOR US! We haven't even started taking off sheetrock to dry the inside of the walls, etc. We had to take out all carpet, flooring, etc. IT IS JUST OVERWHELMING!!

We need large donations but often it is lots of smaller donations that together become large donations! An insurance adjuster has come and taken pictures. Because we are in a valley with high mountains all around, they say this does away with any help we could receive from our insurance. They say "we are sorry".

We had lots of young people saved this summer. That makes Satan mad but God is greater!!! What can I say, BUT A GREAT BIG THANK YOU TO ALL OF YOU WHO HAVE GIVEN SO GENEROUSLY OVER THE YEARS!!!

Folks, thank you for your very generous gift of \$250.00 for the Lord's work here. We love and thank you and sure do appreciate it. Pray that the Lord will meet all of our financial needs.

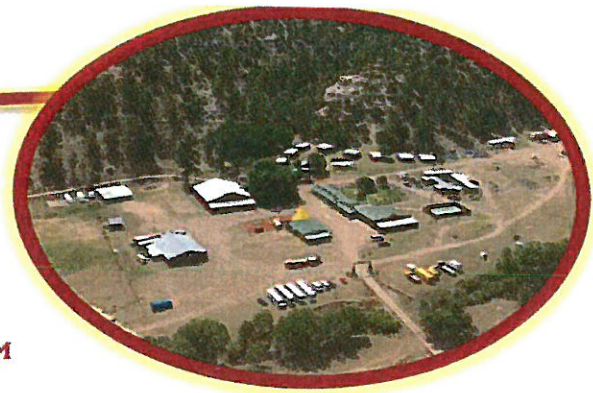

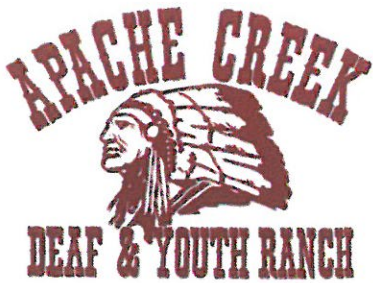

As I write this letter our men and the well men have worked on our well. They pulled the pipe and the pump and put in a new pump. It still wasn't working and it ended up being a wire that had gone bad. We have been going to our RV park across the highway and getting gallon jugs of water to get by.

This week, Evangelist William Ezell is preaching every day to our staff. I'll be able to preach again next Sunday, for the second church camp, and for the big Indian camp the next week and we will see many saved.

Praise the Lord, the big insurance bills are paid. The new well pump and the other supplies and labor cost about \$2,000 and other bills are coming in fast. We need your HELP! God is blessing and many will be saved. Perhaps Jesus Christ will come for His Bride soon. Please come Jesus!

It is important to get all of the bills paid before we go into fall and winter. All of our staff are missionaries and we do not get a salary but must raise our own mission support! We stretch the dollar a long way and you will share in the rewards for the multitudes saved and revived to go forth with the Gospel of Christ. Last October 31st when I had my 85th birthday, Pastor Craig showed me a picture on the internet where he had said that I would like to hear from people who had been to our camp and were now serving the Lord. First, a young man who had grown up under my ministry and is a pastor shared, next a missionary and his wife in Australia who had been counselors at our camp and he said "Pastor, I have started 8 different youth programs just like you taught me". There were also people from Brazil, Chile, and all over South America, Africa, Madagascar, the Philippines and all over the world. **YOU HAD A PART IN ALL OF THESE SERVING ACROSS AMERICA AND AROUND THE WORLD BY SUPPORTING THIS MINISTRY OVER THE LAST 46 YEARS!**

A semi came yesterday with 2,700 pounds of food and food is one of our high bills. We'll have a third work week August 8th to get the new building up. We sure do need folks to help with this.

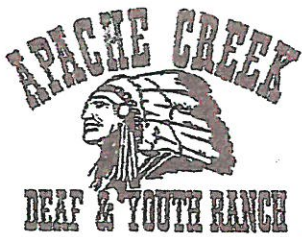



Dear Pastors and friends at Open Door Baptist,

Well the last deaf camp and Richard and Rebekah's wedding are over and we are getting ready to pour concrete before it starts freezing which will probably be in about three weeks. The shop building is all paid for by friends in Wisconsin.

Our camps were smaller but altogether we had 500-600 and seventy some saved! We just had our 63rd wedding anniversary. Normally we'd be making plans to be heading back to Florida but the virus is not within a hundred miles of us here and there have been cases of it in our mobile home park in Florida.

I'm concerned about the vaccine they are developing for this virus. I thought they would be putting it in the arm like other shots but I've read it will be put in the hand between the thumb and the first finger. How true this is, I'm not sure. That is where the mark of the beast will be put in the hand or forehead. Also I've read, whether true or not, if you don't get the vaccination you won't be able to go into any stores or be able to buy food. If this is true, I believe the Rapture will take place before that.

Our county is 150 x 150 miles and I'm working on how to get the Gospel to all of the residents in our county. Please pray for us!

Very few church groups came this summer; less than 10% which are our paying campers. This leaves us short with many of our fixed bills and all of the food we had to buy for the ones who did come plus our staff. Some say if the Lord's coming "why worry about the bills" but I feel it is my Christian responsibility that all bills be paid. Then again it may be sometime; only the Lord knows. I'm praying that we will get some good offerings not only to pay these off but I want to try to reach all of the people who live in Catron County. Some ask "can people be saved after the Rapture". Yes, but they will not be part of the Bride of Christ. God has 144,000 young Jewish men who will be saved and preach Jesus Christ in all languages all over the world. Perhaps millions will be saved – numbers they could not count. All of these will be beheaded for refusing to take the mark of the beast and they will all be resurrected at the end of the Tribulation to go into the millennial kingdom with us. 

We had two weeks of work camps after arriving home and then we had a week of sign language and now our staff is having another work week as the campers still can't come. We pray that soon we can have camp. If we can't have camps, I want to have Revivals for the cowboys, families and merchants. There are 5 post offices in this very large county; it would hold two small Eastern states. The largest town, 220 people, is 20 miles away and I drive there most days to pick up our mail, bank, go to our small store and that is a 40 miles roundtrip. We'll send a mass mailing to each of these post offices one at a time and send our big greyhound bus to pick up the ones who need a ride to the week of Revival. We will do this for five weeks; some are 75 miles or more away. PRAY hundreds will be saved

Our 45th summer is just around the corner. We are all extremely busy with all the projects and details it takes to prepare for our summer camps. I am excited for this summer. It is our 45th summer of seeing Deaf and the Youth of America come to the beautiful mountains of New Mexico to hear the preaching of God's word. So many lives have been changed for eternity. We are so blessed to have seen thousands of souls saved through the Lord's ministry. It is always a blessing to hear of the pastors, missionaries and people that have been called to serve the Lord full time from one of our summers when they were kids. Just as exciting is the young people that have become faithful in living their daily lives for the Lord and raising a family for Lord. Many that the first time they ever went to church was here at Apache Creek. It is amazing and humbling to think that a ten-year old that came to camp when we first started is now fifty-five years old. It is always so encouraging to hear from people that are now grandparents that came and accepted Christ as their Saviour and allowed the Lord to change the entire course of their lives and their families. So many young people that come are not from Christian homes but are the first generation to start a Christian home.

I know that my God will bless us and take care of all our needs and Godly desires according to His riches in Glory.

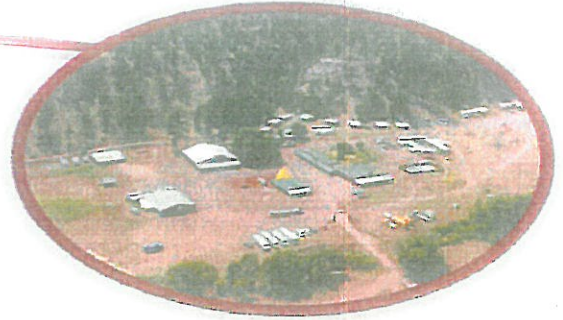

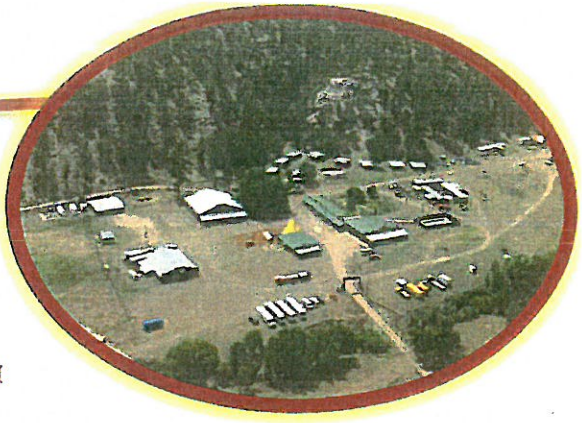

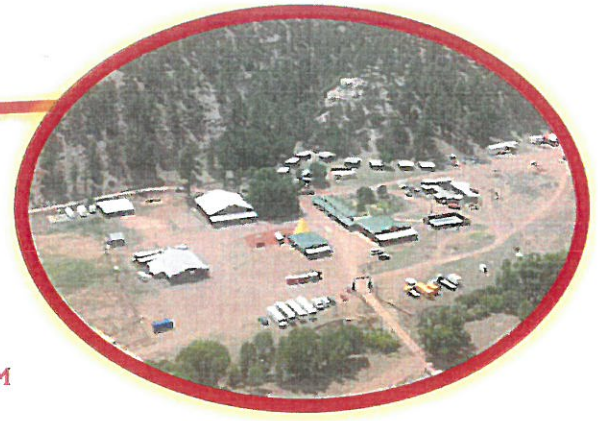

With twenty-seven buildings, the maintenance work is never done. We still have two mission houses that need new roofs and new siding. My home, which was the only building on the property when we purchased the Ranch, is also in much need of repairs. We have two groups that will be coming out to help in October and November. This is a huge blessing!

I want to thank you for your continual support. It is such a blessing that we can continue to do the work God has called us to because of faithful people like you. We have some prayer requests that we would ask you to join with us in prayer. We are looking for a full-time maintenance man. 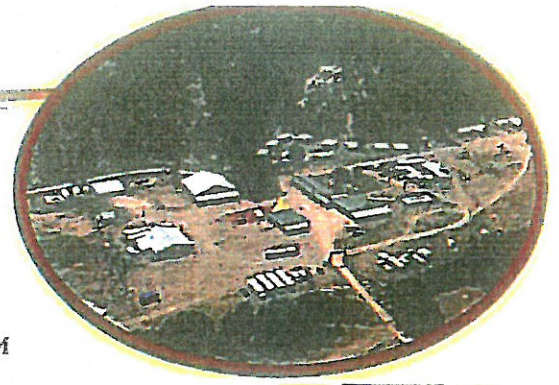

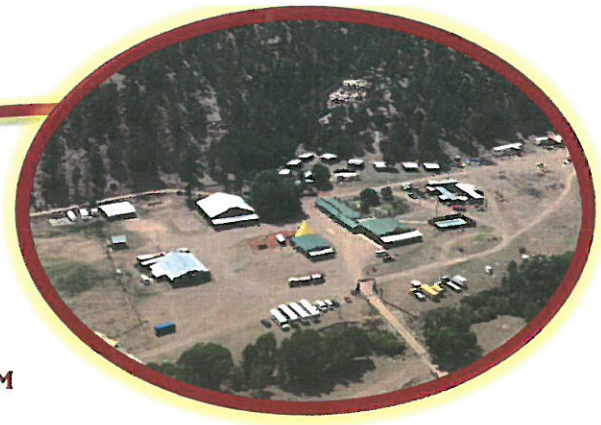

Thank you so very much folks for the wonderful gift of support for \$250.00 to help with the Lord's work here. This has helped so much! May God richly bless you.

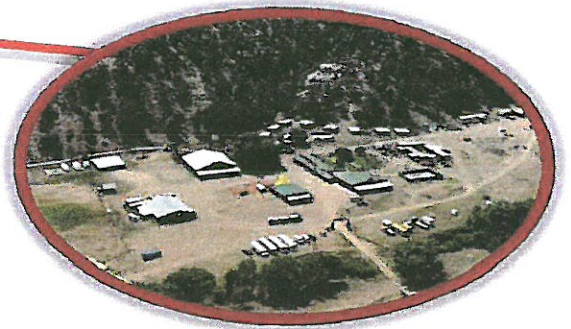

IT'S SO QUIET! Yesterday they took most of our counselors to the airport in Albuquerque. Most of them flew home to see their family for about three weeks before they are back in college. They flew from the East Coast to the West Coast. All summer there has been constant activity. The first week was fair in size but from there it grew every week until I couldn't believe we could pack so many in the pews and every available chair!

Large numbers were saved all summer long, sometimes fifty or more in one service. Literally hundreds were saved this summer. Christians were revived and there was a real spirit of revival! Many will go to the mission fields, serve as pastors and their wives, and missionaries.

The devil knows this and for every summer for the past 42 years he's tried to do me in. I hadn't been home 30 minutes until I had a bad fall and had to go to the ER in Arizona to get my hand sown up. In all I fell 4 times and still in terrible pain but I preached nearly every day. Three or four times someone had to fill in for me and sometimes I could only preach once a day instead of two.

Our trip home in May was 2,085 miles. I would like to find another car I could drive to Florida and leave there and fly back and forth. I'll be 82 in October (maybe not as old as the car I drive now which is 18 years old). It's in God's hands. As I said the quietness is hard to get used to but we'll all stay busy until next summer. I preach every week in Florida.
