Dear friend, who in some way has helped to shape who we are and what we do:

Greetings in the name, which is above every name, Christ Jesus! At the end of June, we received a visit from Taro and Izumi Miyoshi whom we met "by accident" on Hollywood Beach, Florida, last October while we celebrated a belated wedding anniversary. As a child, Izumi had attended church in Okinawa, Japan. She was devastated when the lady who took her to church weekly, became suddenly ill and died. Izumi shared with us how that she could not understand why God would allow such a thing to happen. After several hours of sharing God's Word with her, Izumi bowed her head and prayed to receive Jesus Christ as her Savior. She immediately encouraged Taro to believe. Taro has not come to faith in Christ yet, so please join us in praying for his salvation.

The over-the-summer picnics were successful in that they afforded opportunities to meet new ladies, as well as providing friends and acquaintances chances to gather again. Misa, a member of the weekly Tuesday Bible study, invited five new friends to come and ALL five of them are signed up to attend classes this fall.

Yoshino, a lady who traveled weekly from Richmond, Indiana, to attend our Tuesday Bible study and Wednesday English class, recently moved to Alabama with her family. Though Yoshino is not yet in Christ, she called Renee asking her advice about attending a Bible study that is being taught by a Japanese lady at a church near her Alabama home. Yoshino plans to continue attending our Tuesday Bible study via Zoom.

The fall season for ladies classes is about to kick off very soon. On Friday, September 2 a **Sayonara Summer** event is planned with several first time ladies already signed up to attend. The theme for the 2022 – 2023 Ladies Bible Study is *A Journey Thru the New Testament*. The Troy Bible study begins on September 9 and the Dayton Bible study begins on September 13. Please pray for Natsumi who helps with translating the written lessons into Japanese; she has a 2-year-old son and is expecting their second child in January.

Both Joy Clubs are going well. Mothers often tell us how much their children love to attend. We were reminded of that at our last Joy Club in Troy when, after being at the church building for 3 ½ hours, the kids still did not want to go home.

In late July the secretary of the church where we hold our Troy Joy Club and Friday ladies Bible study, called to inform us that their insurance agent advised them to have us get liability insurance since we are not members of their church. Please pray that we can get coverage and that we can be covered by the time the Bible study begins in September.

The tendency of the average Japanese to work hard is well-documented. In a February 16, 2015, article entitled "Miserly Use of Vacation Days," the author points out that the year 2013 saw Japanese workers take only 9 out of 18.5 paid vacation days they are entitled to. Another static was 16% of the workers took no holidays at all. We have met a number of men who work seven days a week. While one can admire industriousness and dedication, those who know God's Word can recognize overwork in Japan as yet another deviation from God's original plan, i.e., one day of rest for every six working days. Dedication to their company and work makes it difficult for Japanese men in particular to develop relationships outside their workplace. Pray that all of our relationships would develop for the furtherance of the Gospel.

We actually have had many more Japanese acquaintances here than we did in our years of life and service in Japan. The Joy Club children are enjoying the new 2022 series on the life of Jesus. This month they learned that JESUS IS...Our Friend.

Haruno San, a member of the Troy Bible study, returned to Japan with her family last December. She had come to repentance and faith in Christ some months ago, so we were very glad to hear her tell us of her interest in connecting with a Baptist church in her hometown in Japan.

All three ladies classes started back up the first week of February and are resuming their study of the HEROES OF FAITH. We praise God for the four new ladies who began attending this month, one of which is the newest Joy Club mom. Pray with us for the salvation of Chika, who will return to Okinawa in April, and of Yoshino, who will most likely be moving back to Japan this summer.

As far from God as the Japanese culture has been and is, the influence of God's Word and His people on the Far East is evident. As you are aware, the Bible admonishes the saints of God to humble "yourselves under the mighty hand of God, that He may exalt you in due time" (I Peter 5:6). Consider the Japanese practice of bowing, especially upon meeting another person for the first time. Though it is usually done more or less automatically, it nevertheless shows that respect and humility have been built into Japanese culture. May the humbling of ourselves be genuine and heartfelt, not just a cultural, polite, and thoughtless expression.

In January, Tom had conversations with Toru Kamiya and Carlos Elias, with Toru for another of many times and with Carlos for the first time. Toru was one of our Troy Joy Clubbers who is still without Christ, apparently not realizing his need for the forgiveness of sin. Carlos is a professor of music at a local Christ-honoring university who spent four years in Japan as a member of the Sendai (northern Japan) Philharmonic Orchestra's violin section; he would like to establish a student-exchange program with a like-minded-and-believing music professor in Japan. We know a Japanese professional violinist who fits this description and may be interested and able. Please pray for Tom's ability to communicate with the Japanese brother about this, as well as for Toru to come to repentance and faith.

Our 2021 Joy Club theme is SUPER STARS OF THE BIBLE. We began with "Who is God?" in January, "Esther" in February, and "Abraham" in March. We are praising God that, even in the midst of the pandemic, He has given us 4 new children in our Troy Joy Club. Shota Kaito has been a part of that Joy Club for several years and is soon to be graduating from the group. Pray for him and all the other children to be captured, saved, and sanctified by the Gospel, their family members as well. It looks like we will be able to meet with the Cincinnati Joy Clubbers on Easter Sunday for the first time in-person since last March. Pray that new children will attend our annual Easter Egg Hunt at both Joy Clubs.

The two ladies Bible studies' topic for the fall months was "The Beginning," the first 3 chapters of Genesis. During the spring months the topic is "The End," a panorama of the prophecy of the end times. Several ladies meet in person each week and others join via Zoom. It has been very exciting to see the spiritual growth of the believers in the classes and the growing interest and understanding of those yet unsaved. 

Our Ohio sending church has often let us use their buildings for ministry, but it had been a good while since we used the facility this way on a regular basis. Renee began a weekly Wednesday English class using a child's picture-book version of the Bible to teach basic English and the Word of God at the same time. Several of those attending come 80 miles round-trip to participate, so, as no doubt you can imagine, we are very glad for their obvious interest!

We ask you to pray for the salvation and resultant sanctification of the following souls: Tsutomu, Toru, and Tatsuya (and Tatusya's wife Narumi and two children) Kamiya; Shohei and Yuri Shibata and their two boys Yusei and Towa; Yoshino San (Mrs.), her husband, and their two children. While watching the postponed 2020 Olympics some this summer, we were reminded of the austerity with which Japan's and so many others of this world's governments have responded to the reality of COVID-19. Dear praying friend:

Greetings in Jesus' name! Like yours, our ministry has had a different "face" these past several months, but we thank God that we have been able to continue.

Since June, we have been having our Troy Joy Club outdoors. The church building in which we meet in Troy has a huge field next to it with lots of tall trees. We set up tables and chairs under the trees for our singing, memory verse, and Bible story time. Each month we have had a special event day where we did things like an obstacle course, back to school games and crafts, and most recently, a Fall Festival. One big plus for our outdoor Joy Clubs has been that most every child has had at least one parent stay with them. This has given us the privilege of directly evangelizing the parents as well. Everyone participated enthusiastically and has no doubt been blessed by God in one way or another.

The church where we meet for our Cincinnati Joy Club has not held in—person services since March. For that reason, we have been working with the Cincinnati Joy Club remotely by video presentations, letters, and special packages through the mail. We really miss seeing the children face-to-face but were recently encouraged by a video made by a mom in which her daughter thanked us for teaching her about God.

From March until September, the ladies Bible study ministry continued by us sending out weekly devotionals or sermons from churches in Japan through e-mail, and uplifting and worshipful music via YouTube, along with doing some "front yard" visitation. On September 11, we were thrilled to have our first in-person meeting for ladies. We had "Tea Time" in our front yard as a kick-off for the fall ladies Bible studies, which started up the week of September 14. Starting on that day, the Dayton ladies Bible study, in addition to the ladies who are meeting at the church building for in-person Bible study, had seven ladies joining via Zoom. Yumiko returned to Japan last September but is able to join us every week for Bible study via Zoom all the way from Japan – at 10:30 p.m.! With a number of new believers and some non-Christians in the groups, we chose to do the study Who Is God? on the first three chapters of Genesis.

Reika, Ayako, and Eriko were baptized on March 15, the day of the shutdown. Both Reika and Ayako are involved and helping with various aspects of the ladies Bible study ministry. Eriko returned to Japan about ten days after her baptism and unfortunately has not yet been able to get involved with a church in Japan. Join us in praying about that.

Finally, please continue praying that Japanese people everywhere would realize their need for the only Savior, the LORD Christ Jesus.

June 6, 2020

On March 15, we held a special combined baptismal service where Tom baptized three Japanese ladies: Ayako from our Troy, Ohio, ministry and Reika and Eriko from our Dayton, Ohio, ministry. All three ladies gave glorious testimonies of their salvation and Tom preached a sermon entitled "What is a Disciple?" The service was well attended with a number of unsaved family members and friends, including both Ayako's and Reika's husbands. Please join us in praying for their salvation. Eriko's daughter, Nanami, a piano student of Renee's, played the opening song and accompanied the first congregational song. Special music was provided by two American ladies; Julia played a medley of beautiful hymn tunes on the violin and, with some tutoring from Renee prior to the baptism, Sarah sang in Japanese. Everyone present ate dinner together at the end. What a memorable day it was!

Because of the shutdown order given by Ohio's governor that very day, we have not been able to meet in groups since then. But, praise the Lord, Risen Son Ministries is still reaching and teaching the Japanese community in southwest Ohio. We have been weekly emailing and texting inspirational Bible lessons and beautiful music to admonish and uplift the adults.

Our 2020 Joy Club theme is Joy Olympics. Even though the Tokyo Olympics have been postponed, we have continued Joy Olympics for our Japanese children via videos, emails, and sending out worksheets through the postal service. The videos include singing, along with Bible verse memory games and story. The theme Bible verse is Mark 16:15, "Go ye into all the world, and preach the gospel to every creature." Every month a different country and missionary are spotlighted. It has been a positive way for us to bring the focus and need for Jesus to MAII the children of the world.

Beginning in May as the weather got warmer, we have been able to do "distance visitation." We schedule a time with our Japanese folks when we ask them to come outside once we arrive at their homes. Then we stand in their yards to talk and pray with them. There's nothing like face-to-face communication and we have ALL been encouraged and blessed!

On June 13, we have our first "drive-through" Joy Club scheduled. We will have various "stations" set up in the church parking lot and field behind the church where the kids can hear a Bible story, make a Father's Day Craft, go through an obstacle course, etc. The kids are very excited about "getting together" and so are we!

This summer we will add two more Japanese "grandkids" to our family. Haruno, from our Troy ladies Bible study, is expecting a baby girl on June 16, and Natsumi, from our Dayton ladies Bible study, is looking forward to giving birth to a baby boy sometime around July 18. Unfortunately the ladies' moms may not be able to travel from Japan to help them. Please pray for them to have safe deliveries and healthy babies.

Eriko and her two children flew back to Japan on March 24, just nine days after her baptism. Because of the "shut down" in Japan, she has not been able to connect with a church in Japan yet. She is still a baby Christian so join us in praying that she will be able to identify with a church in the very near future. Eriko's husband flew back to Japan to join his family and resume his work in Japan on June 4.

Her achievement is to be recorded in the Guinness Book of World Records. The report also gives the statistic that there are 59,000 centenarians in Japan, or, in other words, 46 out of every 100,000 people are 100 years old or older, including 103-year-old "sprinter," Hidekichi Miyazaki, who ran the 100-meter dash in the world record for his age category, 29.83 seconds. Remarkable, is it not? Our God sees fit to bless this people group with some of the world's longest life spans, just one of His many good and perfect gifts. Generally speaking, do they as a people give Him credit and thanks? Most of them do not, since they do not even acknowledge His existence. We saw the old year out and welcomed the New Year in with our two daughters and their families. Have we told you about our GRANDchildren, Nathaniel and Emmalina? "I have no greater joy than to hear that my children walk in truth." III John 4

The Tuesday Ladies Bible Class began a new study in January entitled, "Who is God?" Each lesson addresses a different aspect of God's person: God is The Creator, Provider, Lord, Communicator, Judge, and Savior. The first five lessons are taken from the first three chapters of Genesis and the last lesson from the book of John. Join us in praying that these Japanese ladies who have been taught from birth that there are many gods, will come to either know the One True God through salvation in Jesus Christ, or will grow in the knowledge and better understanding of the God they have chosen to follow.

The Joy Clubs in Troy and Cincinnati are continuing well. The 2015 Joy Club theme is JOYLAND ADVENTURES. Each month we open God's treasure chest, the Bible, to see what it teaches us about obedience, kindness, forgiveness, salvation, honor, etc. Pray that these lessons would help create a desire in each heart for knowing God, His Word, and His ways, and promote the further progress of the Gospel among the children and all the people in their lives.

We are reminded daily of the brevity of life. Renee's Aunt Anna Maude and Mineko Kojima's father died only a few days apart, both at the age of 97. Aunt Anna Maude trusted Christ as her Savior as a young girl and lived her life loving God and leaving a legacy of following Christ. We never met Mineko's father in Japan, but it is most likely that he went into eternity without ever having his sins forgiven. Daily news reports from various parts of the world confirm the truth that God's creation is indeed groaning and suffering the pains of the curse of sin, in anticipation of the glorious redemption through Christ that is coming for all of His children, as well as for Creation itself.

The tendency of the average Japanese to work hard is well-documented. In a February 16, 2015 article entitled "Miserly Use of Vacation Days," the author points out that the year 2013 saw Japanese workers take only 9 out of 18.5 paid vacation days they are entitled to. 16% of the workers took no holidays at all. We have met a number of men who work 7 days a week. While one can admire industriousness and dedication, those who know God's Word can recognize overwork in Japan as yet another deviation from God's original plan, ie., 1 day of rest for every 6 working days. Dedication to their company and work makes it difficult for Japanese men in particular to develop relationships outside their workplace. Pray that all of our relationships would develop for the furtherance of the Gospel.
