After a three weeks of home therapy that did not seem to be helping they changed me to a special new rehab for these last four weeks that has helped me greatly. I have lost the 36 pounds of water that went to my legs below my knees and my ankles and feet. The large water blisters have healed. Twice a week they have wrapped my feet, individual toes and legs This rehab has helped me greatly to walk again. I have graduated from a walker to a cane. Now they have majored on my balance and strength. They believe I will be able to be back to myself in the next few weeks. Through it all Alice has been my faithful caregiver. I am blessed to have such a wonderful faithful wife.

So this Christmas season Alice and I have a lot to be thankful for, Not only have we been blessed with my health coming back, our house is full with our daughter Robin, her husband Scott and our grandson Jordan being here. Also our granddaughter, her husband Dyami and our two great grandsons, Micah (age 5) and Brody (age 3) are here. We only get to see them one time a year. What a blessing it is when those boys cozy up on our laps early in the mornings!

Alice and I also thank the Lord for our wonderful missionary family. Next to our Saviour and our family you are very special to us. We tell everyone how we are the most blessed people because we have hundreds of friends around the world that the Lord has brought into our lives.

It is our prayer that you have a Wonderful Christmas and a Blessed New Year. During this time we had some great meetings in supporting churches and rejoice in the blessings of great growth in Faith Promise missions giving where I had the honor of preaching and teaching it. In a day when many churches are just maintaining their level of giving, it is a blessing to see some still increasing. Several of our missionaries were in the meetings and were taken on for support.

Needless to say, I was unable to attend and conduct the Retreat.

Alice and I regretted that we were unable to make the Retreat this year. It was one of the hardest decisions that I ever had to make. However, Gib Wood, John Radank and Jonathan Lyons gave great leadership as



well as Rose Radank leading the ladies' sessions in the absence of my wife who is caring for me. Everyone was blessed by Mark & Debbie Lawson for coming from Lupton Drive Baptist Church in Chattanooga, TN to lead the music and for Cookie Johnson and her labor of love again this year to provide clothing for the missionaries.

Alice and I pray that you have a Blessed Christmas and a Wonderful New Year. Thank you for your love, prayers and support. We are honored to be partners with you in reaching the world for our Saviour Jesus Christ.

Missionary, church member, Christian; there should be within our heart a love for all people. Jesus, as always, is our example and model to follow.

The Bible tells us just how much God loves this world. John 3:16 reminds us, "God so loved the world" and Romans 5:8, "God commendeth His love towards us in that while we were yet sinners, Christ died for us." When no one else cared for our soul – God did. When Jesus saw the great multitudes of people in Matthew 9:36, "He was moved with compassion on them."

Our world is in great despair and trouble is brewing everywhere; people are suffering and hurting. How can we help and encourage people within our immediate circle of influence? I believe the answer is found throughout the Scriptures, but Jude 22 sums it up like this — "And of some have compassion, making a difference."

Our human nature tells us to hate the sin and the sinner while God loves the sinner and hates the sin! Who is right? "As for God, his way is perfect" Psalm 18:30.

It is difficult for the missionary as he looks into the faces of people who are different. However, to make a difference in the lives of the people, God has called us to never forget this one word – compassion. The difference is made when people care. Do you care enough to look past the differences? Do you care enough to follow the example of Jesus? Compassion to make a difference?

Every Christian is commanded to have Compassion. "And of some have compassion, making a difference" Jude 22.

Compassion is a Ministry. Be a loving, caring person! People on your mission field, are hurting, discouraged, depressed and many, sadly, commit suicide. I wonder if one person showed them compassion, would it be enough to change their life and move them toward Jesus Christ? When we show people we genuinely care, extending compassion like Jesus, it makes a difference.

This requires action on our part; actually doing the work of compassion. "Even so faith, if it hath not works, is dead, being alone. Yea, a man may say, Thou hast faith, and I have works: Shew me thy faith without thy works, and I will shew thee my faith by my works" James 2:18. Compassion works! It works in America, it works in Europe, it works in Asia, Africa, South America – Compassion works worldwide! And, it is something everyone can do!

Compassion Helps the Church. "Hereby perceive we the love of God, because he laid down his life for us... but whoso hath this world's good, and seeth his brother have need, and shutteth up his bowels of compassion from him, how dwelleth the love of God in him? My little children, let us not love in word, neither in tongue; but in deed and in truth" 1 John 3:17.

Compassion is seen, felt and heard. God graciously gave us a church family where people show compassion towards one another. Last night a visitor with cancer came to the church. She is completely bald. She sat by herself until one of our ladies got up and sat next to her the rest of the service. They became immediate friends. She left with a smile on her face having felt and heard compassion.

Compassion is usually just being there for someone, listening, caring – but it always requires that we do something. Open up your "Bowels of Compassion!" If we struggle with being compassionate, we should ask ourselves why. Jude 22 says, "And some having compassion making a difference."

Compassion Helps and Makes a Difference. The cry of the world has always been a cry for compassion. The needs and hurts are still there, and the cry is still being heard. We can read about the deaf man and the leper in Mark 1, the maniac of Gadara in Mark 5, the possessed boy in Mark 9, the blind man in Mark 10, and the cry of a mother in Luke 7. Jesus in all cases extended His hands of grace and compassion, making a difference!

Compassion will make a difference in your life and in the lives of others; the people you are trying to reach with the gospel of Jesus Christ.

Complacency Concerning Our Faith

of the things that concerns me as I travel is to see the complacency among children concerning communicating our faith with people all around us. This is true here in many of our American churches and even on many mission fields. It amazes me how many good Christians will give to help missionaries go to foreign lands to reach people with the Gospel yet have never personally shared their faith

concerning salvation in our Saviour the Lord Jesus Christ.

One of the ways that show evidence that Christ is real in our lives is our desire to communicate our faith in Him with others. We are not only to keep the faith but to share His saving message with others. Our text comes from Psalm 126:5-6 which says, "They that sow in tears shall reap in joy. He that goeth forth and weepeth, bearing precious seed, shall doubtless come again with rejoicing, bringing his sheaves with him."

If we are not endeavoring to be witnesses and share our faith, then we are not wise or perhaps even right with God. The Bible refers to us as witnesses. Someone has said that a lawyer argues his case; a witness tells what he has seen and heard. The question comes; how can we be more effective witnesses and share our faith in Christ to others?

We must be deliberate witnesses of our faith. Verse 6 says, "He that goeth forth." We must intentionally be sharing our faith. Many feel that they can simply be living a good life and that should suffice as a witness of our faith. Living a good life for the Lord is essential in having a good testimony, but our lives cannot save anyone. People are not saved by our lives but by salvation in Jesus Christ. The Gospel message is ". . . how that Christ died for our sins according to the scriptures; And that he was buried, and that he rose again the third day according to the scriptures" (I Cor. 15:3-4).

We must be <u>distressed witnesses</u> of our faith. Notice it says, "and weepeth." We should be heartbroken over the lost. Jesus wept over souls. Luke 13:34 says He wept over the souls in Jerusalem. (Continued on next page)

Laboring Together

In this passage Jesus is speaking to the disciples, who we know will be crucial to the spreading of the gospel message after the Lord ascends

into Heaven. We know that when Peter gets up and preaches the first sermon, three thousand people will get saved. But it isn't just the work of these ex-fisherman that turn hearts to Jesus. Harvest time is a window of time. Reaping must take place then, or not at all. Our time upon this earth is short and what we do for the Lord we must do promptly. The wages of souls are not of this world, they are the eternal fruit abounding to our account.

When we read this passage we rarely put the emphasis on verse 38, instead we gloss over it as the end. However, it has a crucial message; for centuries God's prophets readied the Jewish people for their Messiah. John the Baptist preached repentance and prepared the Jewish people to receive their Messiah. Others had sown seed along the way, and now it was time for the disciples to reap. The good seed had been sown of which the New Testament ministers gathered the fruit.

When your calling is to invest in lives, sometimes you'll get to reap...and sometimes you'll just be sowing seeds. Sometimes you will pour your heart and soul into sharing God's love with a person, and you won't see them come to Christ. You might invest years; time spent serving, listening, loving them, and praying, and never see any fruit. But, do it anyway! Only God changes hearts.

The timing of the harvest is only controlled by God. The harvesting process is not up to us. Sometimes we reap, and sometimes all we do is sow. And the thing is, you never know what might come of your efforts down the road. The couple you befriended who moved away might experience a crisis, think of something you planted and step inside the doors of a church and become part of their harvest. That estranged family member who rejected your gospel presentation, might meet a Christian co-worker who is able to lead him to Christ. (Continued on next page)

In Matthew 9:36, "he was moved with compassion on them, because they fainted, and were scattered abroad, as sheep having no shepherd." The Apostle Paul says in Acts 20:31, "Therefore watch, and remember, that by the space of three years I ceased not to warn every one night and day with tears." Jeremiah says of himself in chapter 9:1, "Oh that my head were waters, and mine eyes a fountain of tears, that I might weep day and night for the slain of the daughter of my people!" How long has it been since we wept over souls?

We must be dependable witnesses of our faith. Our text says, "bearing precious seed." The precious seed is the Word of God. Notice it says "bearing." Many times when I preach I hold up the Bible and say, "This is the Word of God." I then explain that God has entrusted His Word to us as born again Christians. If we don't sow the seed of God's Word, who will? It is our responsibility to sow the seed. I have been told by some, and on occasions I have seen for myself, tracts, Gospels of John, and even whole Bibles locked up in sheds on mission fields, mildewing and rotting. As tragic as that is, what is the difference of locking up the seed of the Word of God in our lives and not sharing it with those all around us?

We must be devoted witnesses of our faith. Finally, Psalm 126:6 says, "shall doubtless come again with rejoicing, bringing his sheaves with him." What a wonderful promise of God. If we devote our lives by sharing our faith, by witnessing to a lost and dying world, by going, by weeping, praying, and even giving, then we will find the greatest joy in this world is coming into the presence of Jesus with our sheaves (souls) to lay at His feet. No wonder Proverbs 11:30 says, "The fruit of the righteous is a tree of life; and he that winneth souls is wise."

We should sow never expecting to reap, that's another season. We may be there for the reaping or we may not, if we do we rejoice.

Occasionally, we get in on an effortless reaping that cost us no labor, let us not forget that we have entered into another man's labor. Let us not forget that the sowing is the hardest part of the harvest. It takes preparation, planting, watering, and protecting. However, someday, the sower and the reaper will be glad together, because we'll be in heaven celebrating these amazing stories of how one sowed the seed and the other reaped it. We will find out how our stories are intertwined, and it won't matter who did what, because we'll just be thrilled that souls are there with Jesus.
