My wife, Sandra, is well despite caring for me as I had Covid 19! Jessica and our son-in-law, Luis also survived it's ravages. God is so good!!

Rom. 15:20 Yea, so have I strived to preach the Gospel, not where Christ was named, lest I should build upon another man's foundation:

We rejoice in the good Grace of our God having concluded another year (26) here in Aguascalientes, Mexico. We continue to be in good health while others fall prey to all kinds of maladies! The ministry seems to lag and build up steam once again due to the circumstances around us and though we live not by circumstances, but Biblical principles those circumstances affect us greatly. We see how the lack of the ability to provide financially for their love ones takes a toll on the attitudes of people in general and makes it difficult to minister.. Youth suicide is at an all time high compounded with drug and alcohol addictions it seems society is at an all time low. We see it as a tremendous opportunity to share the hope that is in us and although their needs are great we have a source that's ever available to meet whatever need they have.

I went to the Plaza in Jesus Maria where we go weekly, I ran into some elderly men. When I begin to witness to them, as often happen, one man began to relate of all he had done for Christ. I then cut him off as politely as I could, but explained my question was not what he had done for God, but what God had done for him. My original question was if he were to die this minute would he awake in Heaven or in Hell? He began to tell me of all he was doing for God. This seems to be common, but as I stopped him again he could not answer. As I explained the Gospel he lost interest and just walked away. The other 2 men, one of whom was 82 and the other had just turned 100 (yes 100) this month, had no interest and did not want to hear any more and they became very antagonistic. It's so sad as I stand at the door of the Cathedral in the same plaza and ask that same penetrating question, if they died that moment would they go to Heaven? After attending the Mass they have no assurance. Of course they have none, because the poison they have received for the last half hour brings death and not life. We are not discouraged and are not weary in well doing, as we continue to witness and the Lord continues to bring handfuls of purpose.

We have a new family that I recently won and I'm now discipling and they have shown promise. Please pray as we deal with the ever present set backs and seemingly unsurmountable roadblocks before us that we would always see our Lord as being more than able to prevail. Overall as we pray to the Lord of the Harvest for workers would you join with us in the same pursuit.

On a more personal level, we continue to struggle with the water situation where we live, so please pray that the government or the water company that supplies water (or in our case is suppose to and rarely does) 3 to 4 times a week for 15 to 20 minutes is all we get at the present would intervene and bring some relief! The situation is difficult to explain, but boils down to delinquent customers and also, those who tap into the water supply draining off the water going to paying customers. Praise the Lord we are able to buy tank trucks full of water to full our cistern! A real praise item that out shines that grimness is that our electricity bill has been decreased by 75%!! Overall we are content to spend the rest of our lives here on earth in this place laboring for Christ. Thanks again for your continued encouragement through your prayers, interest, and financial help.

Dear Fellow Laborers for the Cause of Christ, II Cor.12:9 And he said unto me, my grace is sufficient for thee, for my strength is made perfect in weakness. Most gladly therefore will I rather glory in my infirmities, that the power of Christ may rest upon me.

As we approach our 26th year here in Aguascalientes, we rejoice in what the Lord has done. We're saddened by the hardness of men's hearts, as I know He wanted to do a great deal more. I feel very Chimelo (The old who have lost their teeth) as folks here would say, but I'm so glad that I don't have to rely on my strength and abilities!

We came to Mexico at 44 years of age and were told by many we were too old, so we are so glad that we came in spite of the "Naysayers". We were told we wouldn't or couldn't learn the language, but though we're still learning the modismos (Idiomatic Expressions) of the small Ranches (villages) where we minister our folks say we do well and are very kind to forbear any area we struggle in. As someone who has lived all over the world, I realize the people will never love what you love till you demonstrate that you have a concern for them. So, in spite of any of our shortcomings God has indeed showed Himself great in our lives throughout these years.

After quite a delay due to Covid 19, I have been welcomed back into the Penitentiary community. The virus still spreads itself amongst the Mexican population, but schools have reopened to 3 days a week. We never shut the doors of the church as God made Psalms 91 more real to us than ever. Several Pastor friends died as a result, but praise God none of our missionaries were affected mortally.

We continue to minister in the open air and door to door, people seem to be more willing to receive us; we do wear mask still. I have our Addictions Encouragement Group each week after Discipleship classes and thought we don't have many it has met the need of those who come.

One of the Pastors we installed (3 years ago) at the church on the 3rd traffic circle, in Aguascalientes, has a son (Cristian Ramirez Jr.) who has surrendered to the ministry and is attending Bible College here in Mexico. Please pray for him as he was assaulted recently; someone tried to rob the dormitory where he lives.

I still remember the words of Dr. Charles Keen, who spoke at my Bible College Graduation service. He said to those of us who were Pastoral/Missions majors: If you are going to wherever you are going, because you love the people you will never make it. He said, "Your better go because you love the Lord"! My love for Mexico and it's people has surely been tried and when I felt weak and ready to quit it was because my love for Him was flickering , but His love for me has never waned!!!

So in spite of pestilence, murderous atrocities, kidnappings, etc..we continue to be your representatives, "Taking the Water of Life to the Desert of Mexico"

Thanks so very much for what you have done to enable us to do what we are doing. Your prayers and financial support are greatly appreciated!

We greet you all once again with great expectation of what God has in store for us in the month to come as a result of what He has done and is doing. We continue to share Christ with all those willing to hear and even those not so willing in hopes that the goodness of God would lead them to Biblical Repentance. A genuine repentance toward God and Faith toward Jesus Christ, that eye opening change of mind about sin, God, and who He is, and what He has done to save our souls.

We have seen those who thru their addictions have gone to prison, but after intensive mind and heart alterations due to the scripture and work of the Holy Spirit make completer turnarounds. I go to the plaza in Jesus Maria, each Friday to preach and hand out our tracts. There's a recent trend to reject them as their priests are commanding them not to receive the material. Now and again some will surprise me and compel me to spend time explaining the Gospel, such was the case of a man I encountered last Friday. It's good to know that in spite of all that Satan tries to do He cannot undue what God does. I also have as many casual listeners that I speak to on a fairly faithful basis, just enough not to wear out my welcome.

One of our men has a small store off the Plaza where we meet to pray for Revival and the Salvation of souls who received material. It is so tragic the after-effects of drugs and alcohol, as many we speak to are in it's grips, One young man, who has been saved and now faithful to our church, has the mind of a child, very little attention span, gets upset, frustrated easily, suffers panic attacks regularly, but I see how much God has done for him and in him! It's very sad as he has children and his girl friends have long abandoned him, yet he continues to come, but is mentally limited. Before crystal meth was introduced to him, he was impressive bright young man! Those who can't seem to afford Meth, Cocaine, or even Marijuana, get high on paint thinner or glue. What a way to try to cope with life, so glad Jesus is our coping mechanism.

Many we speak to have heard a perverted Gospel, but not the Bible Gospel that saves and changes. Co-redemption or the idea that we have to do something or at least do our part to please God in order for Him to save us is a big part of Peoples mentality, today. I am so glad Christ did it all and gives us the Grace to trust in Him and Him alone for Salvation, Sanctification, and Glorification.

I go into the Drug and Alcohol substance abuse center that use the AA Program with little to no results and they have convinced them that they have a disease and it's not their fault. It's the disease of sin and the cure is Christ!

After 25 years here in Mexico, my heart still craves Revival and a stay of God's pending execution and completion of his Judgment here and in the states.

We have some 15 Missionary projects including one of the churches we left in the hands of a Pastor, I trained. Our work in Jesus Maria supports a Widow of a Pastor who died of Covid 19 and originally was a member of a church we all started out together in 1996.

As we began a new chapter in our lives here in Aguascalientes after celebrating 50 years of marriage and 25 years here on the field, we rejoice in what God continues to do for us, in us, and through us. I have had the privilege to fill in for a Veteran Missionary down in Morelia, Michoacán, as he had to return to the states for a family matter. I have made the trip down on Saturday, staying Sunday and returning Monday, as my services in Jesus Maria have been covered by Pastor Cristian Ramirez. (It's a 5 hour trip for me.) He is the man that I trained and we ordained to be Pastor of the Iglesia Bautista Gracia Y Verdad.

We had tremendous services on Mother's Day and God blessed with a great attendance and sweet spirit. I was on visitation as normally I preach on the streets and in the Plaza each Friday and have had good contacts. When I returned to speak to a man I've witnessed to for the second time, he works at a butane gas station located on a busy through fare in Jesus Maria, there was a horrible accident. A man on a bicycle was savagely struck and killed not more than 20 yards away from me and the man I was witnessing to, the phrase: if you died today, had a stronger meaning! The hit and run driver will have to live with this deed for the rest of his live!

We continue to march on knowing that our Lord's return is eminent and we pray He finds us winning the lost with our last ounce of strength! Thanks so much for your prayers for our health as we are both well and continue to enjoy good health. My kidney function is not as good as I would like to see it, but I am working hard on it!

The Covid 19 situation has left the economy deflated and our people struggling to make ends meet financially, this also affects church attendance, but we keep pushing on!!!

Thanks for all you continue to do for us. Pray we can continue to support all the missionaries we have endeavored to support and add some new ones.

After writing this letter and before I could send it out, I suffered a 3 week battle with Covid 19! I'm recovering thanks to God's Mercy and Grace and faithful men who could stand in my place. Was able to preach on Sunday!!! My family is fine and didn't contract the virus!!!

Dear Brethren,

Eph. 6:10 Finally, my brethren, be strong in the Lord, and in the power of his might.

Before I begin our update, I sincerely apologize for my lack of communication these last few months. I have been so wrapped up with all my physical ailments and what they have entailed: going to doctors, labs analysts, and all our ministries; that I have been somewhat overwhelmed.

I have good news and rejoice in all that God has been doing in us and around us and even in spite of us!

Update on my health issues:

Last year I was operated on 5 different times starting with the removal of my prostate and then due to complications on my urethra and also kidney stones that almost cost me a kidney! I almost died due to septic shock and was down to 11% kidney function and 8 days in intensive care unit here in Aguascalientes. I was diagnosed with Chronic Kidney Disease and 6 months into all this was told my renal function would not improve much more than 30%. The good news is that there was no cancer in my prostate, liver, or colon. As you remember my younger brother, Michael, who was also here in Mexico, died at 53 from colon cancer.

More good news! A year of extreme treatments, catheterization each month to maintain urethra function and flow, dietary restrictions, my renal function has improved to 92%! My nephrologist couldn't believe it! This is an incurable or as he says invincible disease that affects the other major organs of the body. I reminded him that I serve an invincible God!

As far as ministry goes, we've been able, by God's Grace, to hold our own during this time of recuperation and treatment. Our folks have risen to fill in the gaps, as our Institute still plods along and I as I write this morning am heading out to the Prison. Pray for our men in the Prison and the Annexes (Drug and Alcohol Centers), also our door to door and preaching in the Plaza.

My health has continued to improve with a small set back here and there, but God has been so good through it all. My kidney function improved greatly from 4 months ago, at its lowest 11%, then up to 37%. Now I'm struggling a little and I feel better and got more evolved as a result of the down time, but the increase activity increased my creatinine level. By God's Grace I have totally avoided dialysis, so I can't complain. Years of eating that which even the medical community teaches as bad for our health has caught up to me, so a total change in diet has greatly improved my physical situation.

The church in Jesus Maria continues to struggle along; we continue to add members and missionaries. Our Rock of Ages Prison Ministry has recently enjoyed and increased in attendance and interest. We were able to procure 500 Bibles of which we have distributed some 100 to Drug and Alcohol ministries and our door to door visitation. We have supported Mexican missionaries since the first year of the first churches we started and have now seen missionaries to Indigenous groups, Jews, refugees on the North Korean border and several countries such as: Spain, Argentina, Africa, China, Columbia, Venezuela, and here in Mexico . We also support Bearing Precious Seed here in San Luis Potosi. We are convinced that we need to help more with needs of those in the Prison and Drug & Alcohol

Treatment Centers, but there again, the differences in thinking sometimes stalemates our efforts to do so. Point in case is my desire to distribute personal necessitates such as toilet paper, tooth paste and brushes, deodorant, soap, writing paper and pens. I have had official application in for a month with no answer. The same has happened when we solicit permission to Baptized or have the Lord's Table as most of the men I have are lifers therefore we sought to establish a local church inside the wall of the prison. We have seen several believers from this maximal security prison that I was able to Baptize and they have been sent to other maximal security prisons here in Mexico. All of these men have accomplished 35 lesson Doctrinal study called, Vara De Dios or The Rod of God. Several also completed a New Testament study by, "Rock of Ages Prison Ministries".

We are excited about the future and I still personally go every week that I can, Door to Door, visiting the lost. Please pray as this is our most frustrating ministry are the cuts, mostly Mormon, Russelites, Seventh Day Adventist, and just as bad the Roman Catholic Religious system to prevail. We lived in Germany for several years and remember how Hitler commented that a lie well told and repeated over and over is powerful and effective, The craziness of these cults has proven this to be so true. It's interesting how God seems to bring in people to the services that we have never visited, but I believe He smiled on our efforts to be faithful to knock on doors fulfilling Matthew 6:33's promise.

A small update to inform you of our situation here in Mexico:

First, thanks for your prayers concerning my mother who has now changed her address and resides with our Lord in Heaven! Our progress as far as the ministry is slow, but steady with souls coming to Christ and following Him in baptism.

Please pray for our health as I have had a rough couple of months and have been seeing a specialist for Chronic Renal Failure. I was diagnosed with 34% functionality, but has now improved to 44%, praise the Lord!

I have suffered with BPH for 20 years, but has become a detriment to my kidneys and bladder, so I will have the "TURP" surgery to excise my prostate this Saturday. Not to worry as we have always believed that where God calls He will also take care of us. Since being here, Sandra and Jessica, have been hospitalized here in Aguascalientes. Jessica had 2 surgeries and Sandra was in intensive care several days for pancreatitis. I wanted to have the surgery in the states as we have Medicare now, but with our current situation found it untenable.

Because the Drug Cartels and regular citizens of Mexico have been robbing the pipelines, our new president shut them down! We're having to wait in line for literally up to 5 hours for gasoline and only get 6 gallons! Since last year, Mexico has started allowing other gas stations to come in: Mobil, Shell, BP, and a couple of others. Mobil being the only one that brings its gas in from Houston, Texas as the other stations buy their gas from Pemex, so at least we have access to some gas!!!

Thank you for your prayers and financial support as we enter our 23 year of serving our Lord here in Mexico!

Dear Fellow Laborers For Christ,

Philippians 1:29 For unto you it is given in the behalf of Christ, not only to believe on Him, but also to suffer for his sake;

As we finish the summer of 2018, we look forward to what the Lord has in store for us in the future remaining of the year. We have seen the blessings of the Lord and the treachery of devil in a sin cursed society having experienced the brunt of Satan's fury personally and seen its damage in the lives of those whom God has given us to work with. As we continue to serve those who suffer addictions with the most hideous and difficult substances, on an average of 120 men and women from the ages of 15 to 70 each week. These people are locked away for a year and a half at a time in a small home. Without Biblical guidance in their lives on a regular basis they will be back. We're still in the prison outside of Aguascalientes where we deal with inmates that for the most part have life sentences and are responsible for the most heinous of crime known man. All of this and the church at Jesus Maria take a toll on us physically and emotionally.

We are in the thick of the battle as I know you all are also. We miss our own nation, but we have resigned ourselves to the idea that the need constitutes the price paid. We see the Lord's sacrifice as the overwhelming all-consuming motive that makes any inconvenience we have experienced a little thing in the scheme of God's plan.

My mother of 66 years went home to be with the Lord last month and has joined my Dad and brother (Michael) who also served here in Mexico. I pray the Lord has raised up someone to take his place.

We were involved in the bus ministry and had roots in the intercity 22 years ago before coming to Mexico and had no idea how God was using it to prepare our lives for service here in this place. Drug cartels and their competitors are definitely winning the war and the Federal Government has had little effect on their progress. All of that on the surface, but we know God is still working in the midst of all the ugliness. We thank Him for the privilege of having some little part in his work.

Thank you for your prayers as we could not be here without them. Your financial support has enabled us to continue our work without taking scheduled furloughs that many times cost more that they generate and absence from the work causes hindrances to our effectiveness. The few times we have come to the states have been indispensable errands to maintain our ministry practically and cause us to stand off and look again at what else the Lord wants us to do here and how to do it.

Please continue to pray the Lord's direction in our lives, His watch care and protection is as important to us as our finances. Our daughter, Jessica, continues to live here with us and is making her way in the world as she will continue to live here after our death. Though we hope that's not for much more time to come; we feel it necessary to see her get established so she can support herself.

Her influence on the people and their children has been such a blessing and she continues to be faithful to the work of the Lord. Please pray for her as she steps out and trust God to lead her in this foreign society. This is something most Missionaries think of as investing their children in a foreign culture.

Rom. 15:20, Yea, so have I strived to preach the Gospel, not where Christ was named, lest I should build upon another man's foundation:

We are rapping up our summer's work excited about all the Good Lord has done and is doing. The door has recently opened and we gladly stepped through and what a blessing awaited us. We are in 3 different refuges for men and women who are substance abusers. We have seen several saved and God has blessed. Our hearts are broken for the masses of humanity that are under satan's evil seductive rule and have bought in the idea that they have a disease. It's sin and the only way to be rehabilitated is through salvation, repentance, faith, and obedience. I have 2 men that are involved in the men's facility and 6 ladies that go with me to the Ladies facility. We take clothes, shoes, and whatever else will encourage them. We have a normal service which focuses on discipleship and sanctification.

The prison ministry has waned as some have left for other facilities and some were paroled. We now only have around 10 faithful men. We have enjoyed as many as 60, so we have seen some of the officials and their wives come to Christ, so we are encouraged to stay faithful. I recently met with the State Commissioner and he's interested in getting me into other facilities. We are asking God to move in behalf of those in charge to give us more time and liberty to do what needs to be done.

We also have started a ministry that will enable us to reach more of the outer villages and ranches, in the states of Jalisco and Zacatecus. We go out on Saturdays and I have Brother Lalo hand out material while I sing and preach. We do this also in the plazas and street corners. I have always believed that door to door evangelism is mandated by scripture, but also feel strongly that preaching on the streets and plazas is scriptural and away to get greater coverage.

On Sunday we had an ordination service for Brother Cristian Ramires, who has taken over for me as Pastor of La Iglesia Bautista Gracia Y Verdad, on the 3rd traffic circle in Aguascalientes. Pray also for his family: Irene, Cris, Michelle, and little Mateo.

We expect the Lord to use our Brother in the years to come and please pray the church will continue to respond positively to his leadership. I have taken the approach of bringing him on little by little and over the past 5 years or so from a teacher to Deacon and now Pastor. It seems to be more effective than going outside the assembly. Our Brother has attended and finished our in church Bible Institute and has proven himself a man of deep Biblical convictions and moral character. Now more time can be spend at our church in Jesus Maria, which is doing well and we see growth even though it is slow sometimes.

Dear Brethren,

Rom. 15:20 Yea, so have I strived to preach the Gospel, not where Christ was named, lest I should build upon another man's foundation:

We have had a very busy last 3 months! My wife and I made a very hurried trip to the states where we were able to report back to 2 supporting churches and present the ministry in another. We drove up and back which enabled us to celebrate our grandson Jedidiah's "1" birthday! What a tremendous joy to be able to see him, our son, Matthew, and daughter-in-law, Rachel. My mother was also in the hospital and we were able to see her there and her return home. She is pretty much bed ridden and will be 85 years old in August.

Although I witnessed to anyone who would listen and handed out tracts all along the way, it wasn't till our return through Texas that it payed off and God gave me the privilege to win a receptionist in a Hotel where we stayed the night and boy was she ready to hear!

Upon our return home in Aguascalientes, I went to a cardiologist as I was experiencing what a thought was some Pectal Angina, but found that it was skeletal chest pain due to Rheumatoid Arthritis (RA). At the end of May I had a stress stress and my heart is fine!! Thank you Lord!

We had great kid's meetings that saw 166 kids and adults attend with 3 Salvation decisions! While on door to door visitation I heard a woman call out and ask for some of the material that I was distributing and as I spoke with her found that she was a Mexican American married to a Mexican national; she had become despondent and suicidal. After 2 hours she was saved!! Patti and her husband are in Discipleship classes and he was saved on a return visit. That have been faithful to attend services and 2 more members of the family were recently saved.

In one of the recent children meetings I was able to witness to 2 men who live on the street and after the service I found them a room for a month, took them to eat at a near by restaurant, and bought them enough food for that month. It makes me sad to report they lasted a week before returning to the bottle. One of the men is totally blind and the other leads him around by the shoulder. It's tough when we see so many refuse the Grace and Goodness of God as for us as Ambassadors of this Grace, we have learned to rejoice in being His messengers that have the joy of sharing His goodness with any who will listen.

Please continue to pray for Brother (Hermano) Cristian who will be installed as Pastor soon. It's a blessing seeing him rise to the occasion and serve as Pastor at, "La Iglesia Bautista Gracia Y Verdad".

On the building of our water tower, we are looking at plan B. I have been to the water company about the first plan I had and they only deal with our rural situation a couple times of the year and couldn't tell me with the next time would be. We need to take care of it this year, so back to the drawing board. God Bless all of you that are praying for us and helping with the cost. It is much needed and greatly appreciated!!!

Good Morning,

Before prayer letter wanted to up date on a few personal things that are happening around here.

1. President Nieto, who has a 12% rating here, stalled gas to the Pemex stations for over a month, making it hard to find stations that were open or close to us to fill our tanks!!! Then he raise the price of gas, 3 pesos a liter, and people went crazy burning stations. Then he also raised the price of tortillas to 14 pesos a kilo. The people here are having a very hard time. The president also gave himself a 600,000 peso raise! With the rise in gas, the price of a bus ticket or taxi also went up!

During this our computer died and we had to take it over to the repair shop which usually wasn't a big deal, but because of the gas problem the really good technicians left because the shop wouldn't raise their pay. Thus, we had a long time getting our computer back!

2. On Friday night a young man, 20's, about 75 yards from our home, committed suicide. On Saturday, Bill, Jessica, and Pepe, 12 years old, saw him at the tree. Jessica called it in and the police came to investigate and pick up the body. It was a long and hard Saturday for us!

3. On February 14, we will be having a renewal of our wedding vows. We had one couple that wasn't married get married, so they can say their vows in the church. A few other couples still haven't made a move, so keep praying!!!

4. Bill is preparing Cristian to take the church on the 3rd traffic circle in Aguascalientes. He wants to move to a cheaper building to rent, but is having trouble. Bill doesn't want to leave him till he is settled in. Pray for them both!

5. Our health is doing good! This March our Grandson turns a year old and Bill and I will be celebrating 46 years of marriage!

Dear Fellow Co-Laborer With Christ,

Heb 12:1 "Wherefore seeing we also are compassed about with so great a cloud of witnesses, let us lay aside every weight, and the sin which doth so easily beset us, and let us run with patience the race that is set before us,"

Heb 12:2 "Looking unto Jesus the author and finisher of our faith, who for the joy that was set before Him endured the cross, despising the shame, and is set down at the right hand of the throne of God.

We are learning the Christian virtue of laying aside the weights and sin which beset us and keep us from running the race set before us; as I hope you as well are doing. We know that the reason we fail to do this is the moment we take our focus off our Lord we run slower or worst yet stop.

If all the folks that have been won for Christ by His Word and thru His churches here that He has allowed us to start would be faithful we would not have a place big enough to put them all. I know you all can say the same, Oh, that we could keep focused on Him that we might be mature enough that we could resist an adversity with a joyful heart. Our folks battle to be faithful to church as they are employed by abusive bosses that expect slaves who work at their beck and call as they threaten them with loss of employment if they don't work Sundays. (Work is hard to come by here) We all have been tested and proved, not so the Lord would know what we'll do, but that we would know and learn to trust Him for everything.

The ministry at the Prison in "El Llano" continues to plug along. Men come and go, but we see a steady flow of decisions to follow Christ. Pray for a man named Miguel who will be released in my care and before you receive this update. He has been incarcerated for many years and hopefully he has allowed the Grace of God to change his life. I only see one aspect of their lives when I am there with them inside the Prison walls. Many of these men get out and become discouraged for one reason or another and go right back in to some criminal activity. Some of the men lack of legal representation stay or they are convicted and receive longer sentences than men who have good counsel. Several men have no idea as of when they will be released, here they do not view that as cruel and unusual punishment. Most of our men look at it as a way God uses to teach them to trust in Him. They say when the Lord lets them out they will get out.

Suicide is on the rise here and the state of Aguascalientes has one of the highest rates of Child and Teenage suicide in Mexico. The lack of hope is so prevalent that despair is common. Bible ignorance is a factor that makes witnessing a chore as it does elsewhere. I talk to people who say they are reasonable good people, but I tell them if they have never read the Bible how would they know what good is. Often people will acknowledge that in a 45 minute conversation with us that they learned more about scripture than all the years put together attending the so called "Holy Roman Catholic Church." Most are cowards and will not risk offending relatives, we show them Matthew 10:32-39 and Rev. 21:8, but it's still a hard pill to swallow as was for us also. We have learned that we are rejoicing in being a witness. The Word in the original language is 'Martir', so that entails rejection and persecution. We rejoice in that as well as those who change their minds and take the idea of and out of their perverted Gospel as most think it's Christ and what they have done or do

saves. What a joy to see that change of mind as a result of Holy Spirit conviction in their faces as they come to Christ and call on Him to save their souls and even greater joy when they allow Him to change their lives and walk in His ways.

Pray as we all grow together in our Lord by His Word through His Grace and Mercy. Pray for our Brother Cristian Alfredo Ramirez Acheciva and family who will be taking the church at the 3rd traffic circle.

Other great financial need is that of a water tank where we live and have services. The problem is that we have 3 1/2 HP pumps that pull the water from our cistern located 125 meters away and up hill to the buildings where we minister and reside. The electricity here is expensive and the rate the commission charges is industrial (can be 300.00 a month) using the pumps. If we can install a 10,000 liter polyurethane tank on a tower that is above the building we can get water brought up the hill by truck to fill the tank for about 500 pesos (\$35.00 dollars). This addition will allow us to feed all installations, bathrooms and kitchen, by gravity and will eliminate the use of the 3 pumps which is the majority of the electric bill and put our rate back down to domestic rates for our electric consumption. The cost to build such a tower would pay for itself as we have to wash clothes in a laundromat that takes the better part of a day to get there and do what we need to do. We have washers here, but can't use them because of the situation. We also will increase the amount of water usage we need when the folks from the 3rd traffic circle when they begin to attend services here. We are looking at some \$4,000 to \$5,000 dollars for the addition, that's material if I do the work.

Dear Fellow Laborers for Christ,

Since last letter we have been very busy, as we continue to build and battle. We had 3 weeks of VBS and youth activities; all together close to 500 participants. We had a great deal of preparation as we had a western motif and it was well received. The kids and women here in our ranch, La Herrada, were the most receptive to the idea as they dressed as cowboys and cowgirls. For the most part these were folks that have attended some kind of service with us before. Therefore, not a great deal of decisions that we know of, but we feel greatly blessed that they would attend. It seems to take years to gain the trust of some folks, but still we continue to preach Christ where ever we go. We have seen the Lord provide opportunities with Doctors, Lawyers, Officers in the Mexican Army, University and Public School Teachers, Law Enforcement Officials, Politicians, Restaurant Owners, Waitresses, etc.....

We are greatly humbled to be a part of God's plan and purpose. We have adapted to our present location, but are not attached to it. We are purchasing cemetery plots here in Aguascalientes, but not in a hurry to occupy them.

We are praying about installing one of our men as Pastor here on the 3rd circle in Aguascalientes. Our plans are to work out of this church as I endeavor to plant a church in Mantancillas, Jalisco. We have already the prospect of land to build on. We plan to allow the people from the 3rd circle to use a large salon (40' x 40') where we currently live with the idea of letting them acquire the money saved, by not paying rent, to purchase land and build their own facility. I will continue to train men in the Institute and encourage the people as much as possible as I begin a new church. We already have prospects for the work in Jalisco and are hoping by winter to get started.

A family that presently has been saved and baptized said it best when they said: "there is no place like this place". I know they were thinking of their church and because of a lack of experience it is really God's Will. They and others are learning that as a result of a steady diet of the scriptures it makes the difference.

We baptized 4 this month as a result of reaching a family of one the men incarcerated in prison in El Llano, where we have our ministry. We had 3 saved on Sunday and have begun discipleship classes with them this week.

Please pray for our ministries: Grace & Truth Baptist Church, Aguascalientes, Liberty Baptist Church, Jesus Maria, Our outreach ministries to the community where we live, La Herrada, and Maranatha Baptist Church at the Prison, El Cerezo, in the ranch of El Llano.

Thanks again for your prayers and faithful support. Because of things that happen we have lost some support and would appreciate prayers in that area. May our God richly bless you all as you toil where you are.
