



WE ARE LATE

We apologize for the lateness of this report. My fall schedule has been extremely busy, and I had computer issues. For those of you who are reading this report via Mailchimp, the hard copy I'm sure will even be later. Below is a note from our printer Please pray for their ministry.

"We are in the middle of trying to get new presses. My current press is down because there is a shortage of toner for it due to a fire at the manufacturer. We are upgrading to three new presses. They delivered the main engine for the first press yesterday, but the toner and finishers will not be in until early next week. The envelope press also is supposed to be in on Monday. I am also behind on thousands of other letters because of all this." Bro. Bill

PAKISTAN UPDATE

Our building renovation project is complete and right at budget! Praise the Lord and thank YOU! Our precious Pakistani Gypsies have already begin meeting in our newly renovated room. On Friday, November 26th we celebrated 3 years of bible study and graduated several students. It was a blessed time of special celebration. Recently our Pakistani Gypsies have been taking a 16-hour bus drive to the Pakistani/Afghan border, where Afghani refugees have found asylum. Our precious Gypsy pastors are leading many to Christ and several have followed the Lord in believers' baptism. We are sending several thousands of dollars to help with humanitarian aid, such as blankets, warm clothing for adults and children, shoes, and basic food items. **Please pray** for this new and exciting ministry opportunity.

KISSIMMEE GYPSY OUTREACH UPDATE

Once again God is blessing in our new ministry here. The Roma are very faithful and not afraid of coming out to the Lord's house and socializing with God's people. We reached a high attendance of 48. Simone has been alternating with another sister in teaching our precious Roma children. We had a special Thanksgiving service on the Tuesday before Thanksgiving. We also observed the Lord's table for the first time in this new work. It was a sweet time. We are planning a baptism right after Christmas.

PRISON MINISTRY UPDATE

Simone and I have been faithful to meet with these precious men the first Friday of every month. They are so excited and anxious to come and worship and sit under the preaching of God's Holy word! They can see our car from the dorms or the courtyard when we pull into the parking area near security and then they start inviting other men to join. The last time we were there the Catholics did not show up, so we had some of their people come to our service. We had the highest attendance yet! 10 precious souls to hear the gospel! GLORY TO GOD! One of our catholic visitors got saved! Hallelujah!

R.O.M.A. UPDATE

On Sunday, October 3rd we held our 3rd R.O.M.A. Sunday at Bible Baptist church in Mt. Orab OH. Pastor Ted House was our host. We had great services and praise the Lord; Simone was able to join me. Pastor House and the church raised \$10,000 for the R.O.M.A. home office. We had a soul saved in that service as well! This special Sunday coincided with the 31st anniversary of Romani ministry in Cleveland. Several thousand dollars was raised for the home office and even some special projects. Thank you, CBC family and Pastor Folger. Glory to God!

It is with a saddened heart to inform you of the homegoing of our dear friend, supporter and R.O.M.A. board member Pastor Carl Fuentes (who pastored the Central Baptist church in West Palm Beach, FL). He had been such a dear friend and supporter of several R.O.M.A. missionaries. Please pray for Pastor Fuentes's widow, Ms. Monika. We thank the Lord that the church's assistant, Bro. Jake Mannon has accepted the pastorate there. Simone and I had the privilege of ministering there in October. What a great blessing it was!

Under the leadership of Spanish pastor and R.O.M.A. board member Pastor Fabio Betancourt we will be interviewing, training, and vetting 15-20 nationals into the R.O.M.A. family of missionaries in the country of Honduras in January. Dr. Sal Yannizzi, who pastors R.O.M.A.'s home church (Bible Baptist Church of Bradenton) will be part of our training staff, along with Bro, Fabio, myself and Dr. Clark. This is a costly undertaking and one of the reasons the home office needs financial and monthly support. We have established a budget of \$5,000. 

Our precious Gypsies are so poor and destitute for some of the most basic of household items such as towels, pillows, and blankets. Items we are so blessed with and take for granted. A pillow at Walmart is \$2.97, a complete set of towels is less than \$10, flannel blankets are \$2.50. A set of hot wheels and a Barbies doll are \$4.97. We do this every year, and we are close to running out of time. The cutoff date for us to have to our packages to the shipper is the end of September. We are still in the need of many items. If you don't want to shop, please send your financial gifts, Walmart and Dollar Tree gifts cards to us and we will do the shopping for you. Simone loves to shop. We are in the need of \$5,000 for Christmas food baskets which costs \$25 per family. The baskets contain a chicken, smoked meat, canned goods, oil, sugar flour and potatoes. We are also in the needs of funds to ship our gifts to Romania. Last year our shipping bill was almost \$10,000. And we are expecting about the same sipping cost this year. Some of you may be asking why we don't just send the money and let them buy what they need. What we buy here could cost up to 4 times the amount in Eastern Europe.

PAKISTAN REPORT

As of this writing with what we have already received and what has been promised we have met our goal of raising \$48,000 to pay off the entire debt due by the end of this year for our church building in Pakistan. <u>Thank you and</u> **Praise the Lord!**

Recently, we have restarted our weekly bible studies online. We have not met for several weeks, as the entire country has been under a complete shut down since early April. Of course, one reason is due to the major outbreak of Covid in that part of the world. Even one of our Pastors had contracted the virus and was extremely ill. Another reason is that the country has been under civil unrest due to the uprising of an extremist Islamic group demanding the expulsion of the French ambassador.

Tehreek-e-Labbaik Pakistan (TLP) was demanding that Pakistan expel the French ambassador over the French president's remarks de-

fending freedom of expression regarding caricatures of Islam's Prophet Muhammad. Police from Punjab province said Sunday's action was in response to the TLP attacking a police station, trapping officers and Rangers, members of a paramilitary force, inside, kidnapping a senior police officer, and stealing an oil tanker containing 50,000 liters of fuel.





OUR NEWEST GYPSY OUTREACH

With the Melbourne and St. Petersburg ministries completely on hold as a result of Covid and other issues the Lord has led us to establish a new ministry to the Roma of the Orlando FL area. We are collaborating with Gypsy Missionary Lawrence Evans and we are alternating Wednesday evenings at the beautiful Bible Baptist Church in Kis-



simmee. We have met several Wednesday nights outdoors and have seen some growth in attendance, though the



Gypsies are still hesitant to meet indoors at this time. Please pray for this young ministry and that the Gypsies will not be so afraid of covid.


blessed day we experienced! ROMA representative, Ted Ricci did Sunday School with an emphasis on the "Growth" of ROMA.

For the first 3 weeks of March I was able to minister at all my scheduled meetings up north. Though attendances were lower than usual, God blessed, and many decisions were made for the cause of Christ! It was good to come home to my precious wife and ministries here in Florida.

These are desperate times for our churches, our nation and our world. But we have the promise of 2 Chronicles 7:14, "If my people, which are called by my name, shall humble themselves, and pray, and seek my face, and turn from their wicked ways; then will I hear from heaven, and will forgive their sin, and will heal their land".

Let me give a brief synopsis of our how our many ministries are being affected. Please pray for each ministry.

• ROMA Outreach, Melbourne, FL

We have not missed one service since we started 2 months ago.



Simone handled the ministry in my absence with some guest preachers. Praise the Lord for a faithful help meet who serves her Saviour with such undaunting dedication. Recently a Roma family moved here from Ft. Lauderdale. We have now added Sunday's services as well as our Thursdays. We are planning a baptism soon.

• ROMA Outreach, St. Petersburg, FL

Our precious Roma people have opted out of social gathering and we have not had services there for quite a while.

ROMA Outreach, Pakistan

The Pakistani government has shut us down. Our people are not allowed to meet and are getting very discouraged. They are having a very difficult time getting their basic needs supplied.



Hungary and Romania

Hungary has shut its borders. The EU is issuing fines to churches who continue to congregate in Romania up to 4000 euros. Our poor Roma are without food and work. Read the excerpt below from Mirci Pricop, who is one of our Roma missionaries stuck in Hungary.

"I come before God in prayer with a heavy heart for I am burdened since I learned the truth about the current situation of my Gypsy Brethren. Many of them are poor even in good times, but now they are desperate. These poor souls usually go begging or survive with the food they find in other people's garbage.

Well, now because of the current situation they are not allowed to be on the streets, they have no help from the government and no means to survive and feed their family."

ROMA OUTREACH MISSIONS ASSOCIATION

Needless to say, many of our missionaries who are out on the deputation trail have had their meetings canceled due to COVID19. That means no "love offerings". These families live from these love gifts until their monthly support increases to eventually get them to the field. Our home office wants to help them with some stimulus money. We have 23 missionary families now with R.O.M.A. Would you please prayerfully consider helping with a 1-time financial gift.

PRISON MINISTRY

My precious wife, Simone has been singing in the Florida penial institutions for over 20 years. She has been going in with another preacher and his wife. The preacher relocated and so she had no one to go in with. I applied to Florida Correction to be a volunteer to minister in the prisons and was accepted. We were going once a

month until the virus. Now everything is on hold. Our first meeting we had 2 in attendance and 1 man saved, our second we had 7 and 2 saved. Glory to God! The chaplain and I have become good friends and he has asked me to teach in what he calls the "Timothy Initiative". This is an institute to train inmates who have answered the call to ministry. He has asked me to teach on missions and evangelism. I am so looking forward to this, another great opportunity to glorify our Saviour and reach the lost with the Gospel of Christ.

Just before Dolly's passing, I was contacted by a Gypsy Pastor from Pakistan. I can't mention his



name nor his village for his and his people's protection. We began holding Bible studies via Skype in October. At that first Bible meeting, two precious souls received Christ! Since then we

have continued the bible studies, but I also preached several church services. At 1 service 12 precious souls received Christ. They are planning a baptism in the River as soon as the weather warms up. They have no meeting place but 1 small room in the pastor's home. Praise God we have signed a contract to-

day to rent a very large home for only \$270 per month including utilities.



The home has 4 bedrooms that can be used for Sunday school classes, 1 large room

to hold the church services and 2 baths and 2 kitchens. Glory to God! We have also sent funds for Bibles and for feeding the hungry children.



Especially those that I had not been with for quite a long time due to Dolly's prolonged illness. I reported in Florida, Kentucky, and Ohio. April found me in Europe, I

BLESSINGS IN HUNGARY

Again this year's calendar provided for us 2 different Easters. In Hungary Easter was April 1 (same as ours). We ministered in Biharkeresztes with Pastor Pali. The services were blessed. The church is under a renovation project as the Lord has miraculously supplied a wonderful new facility for them. God is so good all the time! Traveling with me was a dear brother from Bradenton. He also preached and held VBS in both Romania and Hungary. Thank



you, Bro. Mike Powers for being such a blessing.



I was also able to preach a mis-

sion's conference at Bible Baptist church of Szolnok, Hungary; this is the ministry of missionaries Dan and Patricia Peters. They were away on furlough but Jason and Senja Mann were filling in their absence. God really poured out His blessing on this meeting. The Manns did a great a great job while filling in for the Peters.

BLESSINGS IN ROMANIA

Easter was one week later this year. God blessed in all of Pastor

Fekete's churches. Bro. Lawrence Evans and his nephew Anthony Costello arrived in time to minister alongside myself and with Bro. Powers. Bro. Fekete was not feeling well and asked if I would do all the baptizing for 2 of the churches. Souls were saved, the church edified and God was glorified. I was also able to teach in our institute while there.



HOUSE RENOVATION PROJECT

While in Romania we had the privilege of distributing Easter food baskets to some of our poorest families who live on the very back end of the Gypsy area of Tinca. As we went into these homes to pray and deliver their baskets my heart was touched deeply as to their poverty and poor living conditions. I asked Pastor Fekete how many church members had homes back there. He said there

were 20. I have started raising funds to renovate these homemade mud-brick houses. It will cost \$1,500 per house to put cement on the floors, stucco the interior and exterior of the walls, repair the roof and put a new stove (pot belly type) and a new sofa bed in each one. I have already raised \$16,700 toward the \$30,000 needed.



Praise the Lord. We will start this project soon.

ROMA OUTREACH MISSIONS ASSOCIATION

Dr. Clark and I have been very busy keeping R.O.M.A. in the forefront as we present the need for the Roma people. Please be in prayer for several potential candidates considering making R.O.M.A. their missionary agency. We have one potential candidate who is a El Salvadorian national working in Nicaragua. He cannot obtain his visa to come to the US for candidate training, so Dr. Clark and I were going to take the training to him until we heard of civil unrest in the country. We have postponed until tensions subside there.

"LABORERS ARE FEW"

That's what Jesus said in Luke 10:2. We have invitations to Spain, India and other places around the world to reach the Roma people. Dr. Clark recently returned from the Ukraine where God blessed with souls saved. But we don't have a national to put there to start a church. Jesus said we are to pray for this need in the verse mentioned above. Please pray with us for man power and funds.

There was such an outpouring of God's love from so many friends and relatives toward me and my family. Dolly was most definitely loved by many. Thank you for your calls, cards, emails, and FB posts of encouragement.

As a direct result of many giving financial gifts in Dolly's memory to R.O.M.A., the amount given was over \$14000, we have been able to subsidize our first missionary family. A big "Thank You" to all who gave! Praise the Lord!

With my family's help, we packed up all of Dolly's belongings, emptied the house and then had a huge and successful garage sale. I then put our (Dolly's) home on the market and it sold in a short amount of time. **Praise the Lord!**

My son and daughter- in- law have given me a room in their home in Melbourne, FL, while I wait for the Lord's leading. I haven't been with them much, as I have been out reporting to our supporting churches (for some it had been 6 years since I was last with them) and presenting R.O.M.A.

Dr Clark (R.O.M.A.'s executive director) and I have our calendars synced one with another. That way we can know where we may be at any given time. He texted me after he saw a lot of dates being scheduled on my calendar, saying, "Well, I see your back in the saddle again". I thought to myself well I may be back on the horse, but I think it's bareback.



TRIP TO ROMANIA AND HUNGARY

From October 19 through November 13 I was in our many ministries in both countries. Missionary Lawrence Evans met up with me at the airport in Budapest. He could only stay a couple of weeks as his brother, R.O.M.A., Missionary Nick Evanovich, filled in for him for 1 Sunday in the Gypsy Outreach in Cooper City, Florida. Bro. Evans was primarily there to dedicate the new feeding centre in Calacia, Romania in memory of his late wife, Sally. God used him in a great way to preach in our Roma churches. Many were saved under his preaching! To God be the Glory!



I was so pleased to see that our national pastors have followed the biblical model of churches being indigenous and autonomous (they are not at self-supporting yet, but we're working on it). In my absence, Pali has procured his own facility for the church in Hungary. They have already moved out of the storefront. The Roma church there is well attended and God is a blessing in many ways! **Praise the Lord**!



Pastor Ghitsa has been busy starting a new work near the Hungarian border. The village is Girisu de Cris. At one service many were saved. They are planning a baptism there soon. **Praise be to God!**

Pastor Ghitsa has been given the responsibility to oversee an old church plant that is without a pastor. The village is Gepiu. The church building was in such disarray that we pooled our money and repaired the entire interior. We will work on the exterior this coming spring. Oh my, how thankful this little group of believers were!

ROMA CHRISTMAS

Every year we put donation barrels in the foyer of Bible Baptist Church in Bradenton. All together 700 lbs. of hats, gloves, toys and other items were shipped to be distributed among the children in the Roma churches.

Also with the help of Manna Worldwide and other donors we were able to send \$4,750 to buy food baskets for 144 families. With these funds we also gave our national pastors a nice Christmas gift.

BIBLE INSTITUTE



There have been several modules of our institute since my last report. Dr Clark has taught most of them along with Bro. Mirci Pricop But I had the privilege of teaching there this past November. We had a good group of students who were both faithful to attendance and diligent to study.

Mirci and Mia Pricop are very active in all our ministries both in Hungary and Romania. Mirci speaks both languages. They help with teen and ladies bible studies. Mirci preaches in the churches and teaches the institute modules when we are not there. He has become and a great asset to Pastor Ghitsa and the Roma churches. He and his family are now living in our home in Hungary. The Pricops have 2 children, Naomi and Eli. **Please keep these precious families in your prayers.**

REACHING ROMA IN THE USA

While online one day, I read an article about a large group of Roma families from Romania being placed by the federal government in the small town of California, PA. I contacted R.O.M.A., Missionary Nick Evanovich, as it is only a couple hour drive from Cleveland. Nick and his wife Dorothy went there on several occasions and led some to the Lord. They have already been re-placed by the government to another area. While at the mall Dorothy met another group that has been placed in the Columbus, OH area. Dearest Precious Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

It has recently been brought to my attention that not all of our friends and supporters do email or even facebook, I regret that you have not been kept informed concerning Dolly's home going, graduation on July 11 at 3:15 PM. Please forgive me.

On Friday it had become very evident that Dolly was about to cross the threshold into the arms of her awaiting



Saviour. I contacted our children from Ohio and others nearby, that mom was going away and for them to come and say their "good byes" (really just "see you later"). With all of us around mom's hospital bed in our home, with tears streaming down our faces, we read scripture to Mom and each other from Ps. 90, Luke 16 and I Thess. 4. We wanted mom (I called her mom too), to know that we were releasing her into the arms of her Lord (they say that the hearing is the last to go). A dear brother from our church just walked in at that very moment (he and his precious wife were bringing us a meal), I said "Jim, come quickly mama is about to pass, come and sing some songs about heaven". Oh what a time we shared at that very moment as she departed her earthly tabernacle and put on a robe of pure white. Her suffering and toil from this life is over. No more pain, doctors, treatments and medicine. SHE IS HEALED and MADE WHOLE! Glory to God!

Though many of the funeral arrangements were prearranged, there was still much to do to celebrate Dolly's life and her memory. With such a great affinity with Bible

Baptist church in Bradenton we felt a strong leading to have a memorial service at the church for our brothers and sisters in Christ, who had encouraged Dolly and I so very much through our journey with their prayers, cards, pats on the back and so much more. So on Friday, July 14th we had an open casket memorial service. With the help of Pastor Yannizzi and the BBC staff what a wonderful service it was. Some said afterward, "it was like a revival service". Many had come to celebrate with us; the brother who sang in our home sang one of the songs he sang the day of her passing. We had several Roma families attend and one brother even sang a song in the Roma language. The highlight was when our son brought the message. He took us on a roller coaster ride of emotion; he took us up the mountain with laughter and then brought us down into the valley with tears. Christ was honored as we honored His own.

Since all of Dolly's family is buried in Barberton, OH, we had prepared for her interment there. Dolly was from



Youngstown, OH and so we utilized a funeral home that her mother used when she passed a few years ago. I could not begin to tell you how many had come throughout the day as the visitation was from 2 PM unto 7 PM. The facilities chapel is a good sized auditorium, (almost the size of a small church). It looked like every pew was full. Again God blessed our celebration of Christ and His servant Dolly. Dr. Roger Green and his wife Brenda participated as well as Bro. and Sis. Rusnacko from Euclid, OH. Michael brought the same eulogy and once again God used it in a great way. One of the highlights was a couple from Troy Baptist Temple who are great friends with Dolly and I. I had asked Nathan and Linda Morris to come and sing at Dolly's memorial. Oh, how they blessed us and glorified their Saviour! They sang 2 songs, "I've Just Seen Jesus" and "The Via Dolorosa".

At the cemetery we experienced one of the sweetest grave site services we had ever participated in. Family members testified of Dolly's Godly life, the man who led us to Christ spoke of her grace and beauty. Pastor Ghitsa Fekete along with Mirci Pricop, surprised us by coming all the way from Romania to come and honor their dear sister and her husband.

Finally, we suggested that if there were those who would rather send a financial gift in lieu of flowers could do so, by sending their gifts to R.O.M.A. (see letter head). All funds received will be used to help subsidize R.O.M.A. missionaries. Please earmark your gift, Dolly's Memorial Fund.

To Our Dearest and Most Precious Supporters and Prayer Partners,

There is so much I could add to just the greeting of this letter. Truly Dolly and I are so very blessed to have such a large and caring family in Christ. We stand amazed at the out pouring of love in the form of emails, cards, flowers and even financial gifts, not to mention what some of you post on social media

I'm not going to tell you that what we are going through is easy, nor that we are not growing weary in this battle we have been fighting for several years now. But please, be assured that your prayers are being answered. I would like to say that they are being answered with a change in Dolly's prognosis, but God has answered your prayers by the great peace He has bestowed upon our hearts and minds. We are truly resting in the Everlasting Arms of our sweet Saviour!

I usually fill up a report with photos of our ministries. God has done so much here in the US and Eastern Europe. I just stand in amazement of how He has blessed all of our workers and the ministries they are involved in. All to God's glory, souls are being saved, believers baptized, preachers trained, and hungry children are being fed. I am so thankful for Dr. Tim Clark who is the "face" of Gypsy ministry and our new board R.O.M.A., while I minster to the needs of my wife.

I am thankful for you blessing our son Mike and his family with their transition to stateside ministry. Thank you for praying for our little grandson Joey, who has been seizure free for several months. Glory to God! Thank you for those who provided that our poor Roma could have a blessed Christmas again. We are praying that this coming Easter will be as blessed. Thank you for helping Lawrence Evans during the home going of his dear wife, Sally. We miss her greatly. Sally was Dolly's best friend. Thank you for helping Lawrence to start up a feeding center in Romania in Sally's honor. God is answering your prayers and returning spiritual dividends into your account in heaven

Let me finish this letter with Dolly's situation. Most of you know that the oncologist told Dolly this past August that she would have as little as 6 months to a year without any treatment. Praise God she has passed the 6th month mark! The doctor was amazed as to how much Dolly deteriorated. Dolly's last attempt for treatment was immune therapy. Only to find out that Dolly's cancer, is not included in this new type of cancer therapy. The only treatment option they were offering Dolly was more chemotherapy and that she would be on it the rest of her life. For Dolly and I this was not an option as there is NO quality of life with chemo on a long term basis. Since Dolly rejected the chemo option the doctor recommended that Dolly be under hospice care to manage her pain and symptoms. The hospice nurse comes to our home once per week. Dolly grows weaker and weaker as the days go by. Some days she'll have a burst of energy and we will go out for a meal. These days are less frequent now. She spends most of the time resting. She uses a walker or wheelchair when she does get out of the house. She is also on oxygen as needed and time release morphine and oxycodon for her pain. Well that's it for now. Again, "Thank you", for all that your do for our Lord and us.

Report on Dolly

Dear Praying Friends,

I'm sorry there is so much time between reports, but as Dolly's care giver, domestic responsibilities and still trying to oversee our US and European ministries, time just gets away from me. Mike and his family have taken a position in a church on the east coast of Florida, so it is just the 2 of us now.

As you know Dolly is now under Hospice care in our home. The nurse comes weekly. She is deteriorating daily and is in pain most days. There are days she has a burst of energy and we might go out for a meal, but then she "bottoms out". She is on several strong pain medications. She stays in bed most of the time. We do not know what the cancer is doing, but right now her leg pain from the deep vein thrombosis is what is bothering her the most. We cannot put her on blood thinners as that would or could start the hemoptysis again. We are so glad that that has subsided. Glory to God!

I have an armoire in our bedroom that I have converted into a small work station, as I cannot get to the ROMA office very much these days. As I write this letter, Dolly is still sleeping. Dolly breaths heavy when she sleeps. I am so glad that I can still hear her breathes. I don't want to lose my precious Dolly, but I do not want her to suffer either. Please pray for God's perfect will.

All of our ministries are prospering under God's good hand of blessing. Eastern Europe is experiencing an unusual and extreme cold winter. This is difficult on our precious Roma people as wood to burn for cooking and heating is scarce right now and very expensive. Our institute will start up again on 2/1. It cost about \$1,700 to \$2,000 to hold a 2 week module. This includes food, utilities, wood, office supply, cooks and translators. I have raised very little monthly support for the institute. Please pray about this need.

Bro. Clark departs tomorrow to head up our institute module and minister to our missionaries and their churches. Please pray for his safety and ministry while in Eastern Europe. We did not get many commitments to purchase the camp; we have taken that as God telling us it is not His will.

Thank you for your prayers, support, cards, letters, phone calls and emails. You are a tremendous blessing to us and our ministries. We love you.

P.S. I'll try to be more faithful with my reporting

May God bless you abundantly in 2017! Dolly and I love and appreciate each of you very much. Dear Praying Freinds,

I'm so very sorry I have not kept you updated concerning Dolly. Everything is about the same. She seems to have good to very bad days. Hospice has been such a great blessing. We praise the Lord that Dolly's hemoptysis has subsided. This is a great blessing and answer to prayer. As a result she did not have to undergo the radiation treatments, as they were being considered as an option to stop the bleeding.

She has developed more blood clots in her legs. She was experiencing great discomfort and had an ultrasound done which revealed some old and new clots. Because of Dolly's potential bleeding, blood thinners were not recommended. She elevates her legs and wears support stockings most of the time. Along with some strong pain medication this keeps her as comfortable as possible.

I do not leave Dolly at home alone any more. I thank the Lord that Mike and Sarah are still here (until January when they move to the other coast of Florida to take an assistant pastors position). For now, we take turns staying with Dolly, while we go to church.

Thank you for your prayers and concern. Ill try to be more faithful with my reporting. But I am the main caregiver to Dolly and my time just gets away from me.

A Brief Report

Dear Precious Friends and Supporters

Though the summer issue of our quarterly report will come out soon, I thought it necessary to get a brief report out concerning Dolly and her health situation. One church recently called and asked if Dolly was in an area hospital. She was not. This is probably my fault as I have not posted much recently as my schedule has been full with caring for Dolly, overseeing our European ministries (stateside), promoting our new mission agency R.O.M.A. and making inroads into the Roma community of Bradenton and Sarasota. I thank the Lord for my dear and precious co-laborer, Dr. Tim Clark who has been handling most of the "on the ground" ministry duties in Romania. With 4 churches, 2 national pastors, Bible Institute, feeding centers and 2 EEGBI graduates preparing to establish a new work, it's a lot to oversee.

In June Dolly had a routine checkup which involved a CT scan, Please keep in mind that Dolly was NOT symptomatic at this time. We were very surprised to hear that the tumors had almost doubled in size. Since Dolly does not want Chemo anymore we began investigating some clinical trials. We were presented by some dear friends at church of some break through for cancer in the area of immune therapy. We then followed up with this possibility at a cancer clinic here in Bradenton, FL. The doctor had Dolly take a PET scan. This scan revealed that not only were the tumors growing, but they were growing at a more rapid and aggressive rate. The doctor then told us that Dolly was not a candidate for immune therapy and the only other treatment options for her were chemo and/or more radiation. She also said that Dolly was at stage 4 and without treatment would make not make it through the year.

Thank you for always thinking of us and praying for us. Dolly seems to be getting weaker and weaker day by day. But we praise the Lord that some days she has a burst of energy and then bottoms out after a few hours. The hemoptysis is getting worse. We see another oncologist this coming Tuesday (9/13) in Cleveland, OH. It's mostly to satisfy our children, but who knows what God might do. Please be in prayer for our family. Our adult children are not taking the news about Dolly very well, of course this is understandable. They just want their mama to be around a little longer, (I think a lot longer) and so do I. I just can't stand to watch Dolly suffer anymore, with this wretched disease and all its side effects.

I am on the road the rest of this fall, reporting to churches that I have not been with for several years and presenting R.O.M.A. I will have Dolly with me most of the times. The only times I leave her alone is when I go to meetings, then I hurry back to be at her side, I would hate for something to happen to her and me not be there. Sometimes when I can't avoid being away overnight, one of our daughters stay with her. This past spring when I began to schedule meetings for the fall she was doing so well. Since things have so drastically changed in such a short amount of time, I was going to cancel my entire itinerary and go home, but Dolly wouldn't let me. Needless to say this is very difficult. I know you realize that I am not looking for pity; the Sweet Lord Jesus is near and upholding us. This is not just wishful thinking, I really mean it, and it is true. Though we weep and cry out to God for a miracle, we know that He knows what is best.


CHRISTIAN MEDIA INTERNATIONAL





We have been in an absolute medical whirlwind. The last episode was an emergency room visit because of Dolly's elevated blood pressure. The unusual thing is that Dolly never had high blood pressure in the past. She spent two days in a local hospital and went through a gamut of tests, which all came back clear. For which we are praising the Lord. She is now on 4 blood pressure medications. Though her levels are somewhat under control it is still up and down. Now it is just a balancing act of trying to regulate the medication. At least they are lower than what they were when we took her to the emergency room and she was suffering from severe headaches. 

SUPRISE VISIT

Our son Mike and his family surprised us with a short visit right after Christmas. Mike had wanted to come and visit his mom ever since she started treatments well over a year ago, but I kept stopping him. He finally said; "dad you can't stop this time". It was great to have them and our three youngest grandchildren with us for a whole month. Our two grandsons also had some health issues resolved while they were here. WHAT A SAVIOUR!

DOLLY'S REPORT

Thanks for all your prayers for Dolly. Things began to spiral downward for Dolly on December 23rd. She was hospitalized through the emergency dept. for coughing up blood. Not a good thing for someone on blood thinners and has lung cancer. While waiting for a bronchoscopy, the bleeding subsided and she was sent home the next day. Later it was determined that Dolly CANNOT be on blood thinning medication for clotting any more. Thus an immediate decision was made to insert an intravenous filter to protect her vital organs from clotting. It is not 100% fool proof, but better than nothing at all. Now, most recently Dolly had a CT scan and saw her oncologist. He thrilled us with good news that the cancerous tumors have reduced in size and the cancer is in stable condition. He also wants Dolly off of the treatment until her next CT, April 24. Please continue praying for Dolly.

SPEAKING OF HEALTH

One night while Mike was here, I went to bed and the room would not stop spinning around and around. I was rushed to the hospital by ambulance and was diagnosed with vertigo. I was treated and released the next morning. I am following up with an ENT specialist. Please pray for me.

In November we celebrate our 25th year of Roma (Gypsy) ministry. It's hard to believe that so much time has passed. Much has transpired these 2 ½ decades. It's all to God's glory! It's not a huge reduction but a reduction none the less. We were also encouraged by the anti-coagulant doctor who said that Dolly's blood clots are gone and her blood thickness is under control. Though she must stay on medication, she has given Dolly the spring of 2015. Dolly will be tested again in January. Please continue to pray for Dolly's health





PURPOSELY LATE

Our official prayer letter/report has been purposely late in order to be able to update you with better and current information concerning our situation with Dolly's cancer. Though, we have been sending out updates via email and social media. Here is where stand today. After Dolly's chemo there was some minimal reduction in her tumors, but it was also discovered that blood clots were in both of Dolly's lungs. She was hospitalized immediately and put on blood thinning medications. We then counseled with Dolly's oncologist and were told that Dolly would have to "be on chemotherapy the rest of her life." Because of the poor quality of life a cancer patient experiences during chemotherapy, this was not an option for us. We prayed and asked God for direction. God directed us to contact the Moffitt Cancer Center in Tampa, Florida. At Moffitt, Dolly was tested again. At first the doctor thought that there was some continued reduction in Dolly's tumors and was putting chemotherapy "in his back pocket." But after the doctor investigated further with the radiologist, he determined this was not the case, Not only does he feel there has been some growth, but to our dismay possibly some new lesions as well. The only treatment options were a different type of chemotherapy drug or back on hormone therapy. Dolly has opted for the latter. Please pray for a favorable outcome.

FIRST REAL FURLOUGH

The end of August will be one year since we came stateside due to Dolly's mom's failing health. This is the first real furlough we have ever had. The dictionary defines furlough as follows; "a leave of absence, especially that granted to a member of the armed services". We may not be soldiers in the military but we are most definitely soldiers of the cross.





Easter services were celebrated in all of our churches and there were blessed revival meetings in our Gypsy churches as well with many souls saved.



It was difficult to do but, we had to cancel 2 of our supporting churches who were bringing teams to minster to our people. Most disappointing of all was not being able to start the church in Oradea, which meant canceling Couriers for Christ coming to hold a large campaign to help with this church plant. We praise the Lord that Jerry Abbott of Manna did come with a group of dentists.

OUR MOMS

Dolly's mom rebounded after a few weeks when we first arrived, but then she finally went home to heaven. Her funeral was a great memorial to a very special lady indeed. My mom's cancer has spread throughout and the doctors have given her just a few months. She is looking forward to heaven.

OUR FUTURE

It, therefore, has been determined by divine providence and, as a result, of Dolly's health situation that our ministries in Europe have been put on hold. Our future of fulltime involvement in European Gypsy ministry seems unclear, especially with the fact that due to Dolly's cancer, blood clots, treatments and general health, she may never return to Europe again. We are now residing in Bradenton, Fl as Dolly undergoes medical treatment in Tampa. We are surrounded by Gypsies! You will find Gypsy fortune tellers here on almost every major street and highway. In the past, I have even preached to the Gypsies of Bradenton at the Bible Baptist Church back when I had a ministry in Miami. I led the Roma patriarch to Christ and had the privilege of baptizing him over a decade ago. Marco Mitchell is in heaven now, but his large family resides here in Bradenton, Sarasota and surrounding communities. If the Lord allows, we will start a ministry here to the Roma. I still have several ministry "irons in the fire" in Hungary and Romania. As Dolly's health allows, and I have the liberty to leave her side, I will continue to minster there from time to time. I am planning on being at the graduation of our institute in October of this year. I still oversee our many ministries there and assist Pastor Rafael and Pastor Fekete.





Our 6th annual pastors and missionaries' fellowship was held at Camp of Joy. Pastor Balaciu hosted the meeting and Dr. Roger Green was our speaker again. All were blessed.



We also missed out on our son Michaels' first service in Bucharest as the church was planted this past spring. He has experienced souls saved, visitors and a good start.



Glad to say we were able to ship another 700 lbs of school clothing to Romania.
